SENATE BILL NO. 1533

To the New Jersey Senate:

Pursuant to Article V, Section I, Paragraph 14 of the New Jersey Constitution, I am returning Senate Bill No. 1533 with my recommendations for reconsideration.

A. Summary of Bill

This bill designates methadone clinics as business or commercial operations for zoning purposes, absent any municipal ordinance to the contrary. The bill also prohibits methadone clinics from being construed, for zoning purposes, as ancillary or adjunct to a doctor's professional office. As a result, the siting of such drug treatment facilities will be limited to commercial or business zones, unless a municipality takes an affirmative step to permit such clinics to be sited in residential zones.

B. Recommended Action

I commend the sponsors of this bill for recognizing the need to address the impact of methadone clinics on residential neighborhoods. I recognize that municipalities have an important interest in directing the location of methadone clinics, and this legislation is an important step towards that goal.

Under current law (P.L.1975, c.291 C.40:55D-1 et seq.), municipalities have the flexibility to zone drug treatment facilities as they deem appropriate and are not required to zone such facilities in a particular manner. Such flexibility assures municipalities and community members local control over their neighborhoods. I have been advised, however, that some confusion exists regarding municipalities' authority to zone methadone clinics under current law. Therefore, I recommend that this bill be amended to clarify that a municipality has the authority to affirmatively pass an ordinance defining methadone clinics as business or commercial operations for zoning purposes.

Therefore, I herewith return Senate Bill No. 1533 and recommend that it be amended as follows:

Governor Whitman today signed the following legislation:

S-1533, sponsored by Senator Cafiero (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland) and Assembly Members Gibson (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland) and Asselta (R-Cape May/Atlantic/Cumberland), designates methadone clinics as business use for zoning purposes.
