The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 792.

This bill provides that any public school program or course in sex education and any materials presented on school property including, but not limited to, handouts, speakers or audiovisuals, concerning the prevention of HIV infection and other sexually transmitted diseases and on avoiding pregnancy must stress that abstinence from sexual activity is the only completely reliable means of eliminating the sexual transmission of HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases and of avoiding pregnancy.

The bill also requires a board of education to include within its family life and HIV/AIDS curriculum instruction on reasons, skills, and strategies for remaining or becoming abstinent from sexual activity. Any instruction concerning the use of contraceptives, such as condoms, must include information on their failure rates for preventing pregnancy, HIV infection, and other sexually transmitted diseases in actual use among adolescent populations.
