STATEMENT

7 This bill amends a recently enacted statute, P.L.2000, c.103, which 8 extended eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school 9 pupils who reside more than 20 miles from their school of attendance and who live in regional school districts composed of only two 10 11 constituent municipalities. Under that law, if the regional school 12 district was providing transportation to nonpublic school students who 13 lived within the 20 mile radius of the nonpublic school as is normally 14 required for eligibility for nonpublic transportation services, then the 15 regional district would provide transportation or an in-lieu-of payment to nonpublic school students who lived beyond the 20 mile radius and 16 17 attended that school. It was the intent of the sponsor of P.L.2000, 18 c.103 that this benefit also be extended to nonpublic school students 19 who live in regional school districts composed of only two constituent 20 municipalities when the district is not providing actual transportation 21 services to students within the 20 mile radius, but rather is providing 22 in-lieu-of payments. The sponsor's bill as originally drafted and 23 introduced contained this provision, however, in the course of 24 legislative deliberations, this provision was inadvertently omitted. This 25 bill corrects that omission and extends eligibility for transportation 26 services to nonpublic school students who live within a regional school 27 district composed of only two constituent municipalities and attend a 28 nonpublic school which is more than 20 miles from the pupil's 29 residence, when the regional school district is making in-lieu-of 30 payments to nonpublic school students who live within 20 miles of the 31 same nonpublic school.

This bill will apply to the 2000-2001 school year so that nonpublic school students who were inadvertently denied benefits under P.L.2000, c.103 will be entitled to receive those benefits for the current school year.

The Assembly Education Committee favorably reports Assembly Bill No. 2928 with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill amends a recently enacted statute, P.L.2000, c.103, which extended eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school pupils who reside more than 20 miles from their school of attendance and who live in regional school districts composed of only two constituent municipalities. Under that law, if the regional school district was providing transportation to nonpublic school students who lived within the 20 mile radius of the nonpublic school as is normally required for eligibility for nonpublic transportation services, then the regional district would provide transportation or an in-lieu-of payment to nonpublic school students who resided within the district and lived beyond the 20 mile radius and attended that school. Any cost incurred by a district in implementing that law was to be paid by the State.

This bill extends eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school students who live within a regional school district composed of only two constituent municipalities and attend a nonpublic school which is more than 20 miles from the pupil's residence, when the regional school district is making in-lieu-of payments to nonpublic school students who live within 20 miles of the same nonpublic school.

This bill will apply to the 2000-2001 school year so that nonpublic school students who were denied benefits under P.L.2000, c.103 will be entitled to receive those benefits for the current school year.

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the definition of regional school district contained in the bill includes consolidated school districts composed of only two municipalities.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R).

Under that law, if the regional school district was providing transportation to nonpublic school students who lived within the 20 mile radius of the nonpublic school as is normally required for eligibility for nonpublic transportation services, then the regional district would provide transportation or an in-lieu-of payment to nonpublic school students who resided within the district and lived beyond the 20 mile radius and attended that school. ## **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000 amends a recently enacted statute, P.L.2000, c.103, which extended eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school pupils who reside more than 20 miles from their school of attendance and who live in regional school districts composed of only two constituent municipalities. Under that law, if the regional school district was providing transportation to nonpublic school students who lived within the 20 mile radius of the nonpublic school as is normally required for eligibility for nonpublic transportation services, then the regional district would provide transportation or an aid in-lieu-of payment to nonpublic school students who resided within the district and lived beyond the 20 mile radius and attended

This bill requires a regional school district composed of only two municipalities to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments to a nonpublic student residing in the regional school district and attending a nonpublic school which is more than 20 miles from the student's home if that district is providing aid-in-lieu of payments, not just transportation as under current law, to a nonpublic student who resides in the regional district and lives within 20 miles of the student's nonpublic school.

This bill clarifies that the definition of "regional district" includes consolidated districts composed of only two municipalities.

This bill will apply to the 2000-2001 school year so that nonpublic school students who were denied benefits under P.L.2000, c.103 will be entitled to receive those benefits for the current school year.

#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES**

For the reasons given below, the Office of Legislative Services finds that the cost of Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000 cannot be determined.

Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000 amends P.L.2000, c.103 which extended eligibility for transportation services to a nonpublic school pupil who resides more than 20 miles from the pupil's school of attendance and who lives in a regional school district composed of only two constituent municipalities if the regional school district provides transportation to a nonpublic student who resides in the regional district remote from the same nonpublic school but not further than 20 miles from that school. According to the Department of Education, the cost of implementing P.L.2000, c.103 was \$49,865.

The table below provides information from the Department of Education concerning the districts affected by Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000 and the provision of transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for certain nonpublic students.

Under Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000, there are 34 regional districts that may be

required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments under certain circumstances. Under current law as implemented by the Department of Education, only the 27 two constituent municipality regional districts are required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments to a pupil living more than 20 miles from the pupil's nonpublic school of attendance, if the district is already providing **transportation** for another pupil who resides not more than 20 miles from the same nonpublic school. Under Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000, these districts are also required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments if the district is already providing **transportation** or aid-in-lieu of payments if the district is already provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments if the district is already providing **aid-in-lieu of payments** for another pupil who resides not more than 20 miles from the same nonpublic school.

Assembly Bill No. 2928 (1R) of 2000 also clarifies that seven two constituent municipality consolidated districts are included under the law's provisions and would have to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments under the same circumstances as two constituent municipality regional districts. Since the Department of Education did not include consolidated districts when it implemented P.L.2000, c.103, the information in the table concerning the provision of transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments refers to pupils living in the consolidated district, remote from a nonpublic school but not further than 20 miles from that school. All consolidated districts provide either transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for these pupils. Therefore under this bill, they would also be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for any other pupil who resides in the district, goes to one of the same nonpublic schools and lives more than 20 miles from that nonpublic school. The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) does not have information on which nonpublic schools are attended by pupils for which the district provides transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments or the number of students living further than 20 miles from those same nonpublic schools for which a consolidated district will be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments.

OLS notes that under P.L.2000, c.103, the situation that triggers the requirement that a district provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for a nonpublic school pupil residing in the district and living more than 20 miles from a nonpublic school is already in place for 26 of the 27 districts and that implementing P.L.2000, c.103 cost the State \$49,865. This bill would amend current law to provide that an aid-in-lieu of payment made for a pupil who resides in the district and attends a nonpublic school not further than 20 miles from the pupil's home would trigger the requirement that a district also provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for a nonpublic school pupil residing in the district, attending the same nonpublic school and living more than 20 miles from that nonpublic school. OLS does not have information on which nonpublic schools are attended by pupils living within 20 miles of those schools for which the district already provides aid-in-lieu of payments or the number of pupils living further than 20 miles from those same nonpublic schools for which the regional district would be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments which the bill.

Any cost incurred by a district in implementing that law was to be paid by the State. 18 19 This bill extends eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic 20 school students who live within a regional school district composed of 21 only two constituent municipalities and attend a nonpublic school 22 which is more than 20 miles from the pupil's residence, when the 23 regional school district is making in-lieu-of payments to nonpublic school students who live within 20 miles of the same nonpublic school. 24 This bill will apply to the 2000-2001 school year so that nonpublic 25 26 school students who were denied benefits under P.L.2000, c.103 will 27 be entitled to receive those benefits for the current school year. 28 The bill also clarifies that the definition of regional district includes 29 consolidated districts of only two municipalities.

The Senate Education Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2558.

This bill amends a recently enacted statute, P.L.2000, c.103, which extended eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school pupils who reside more than 20 miles from their school of attendance and who live in regional school districts composed of only two constituent municipalities. Under that law, if the regional school district was providing transportation to nonpublic school students who lived within the 20 mile radius of the nonpublic school as is normally required for eligibility for nonpublic transportation services, then the regional district would provide transportation or an in-lieu-of payment to nonpublic school students who resided within the district and lived beyond the 20 mile radius and attended that school. Any cost incurred by a district in implementing that law was to be paid by the State.

This bill extends eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school students who live within a regional or consolidated school district composed of only two constituent municipalities and attend a nonpublic school which is more than 20 miles from the pupil's residence, when the regional or consolidated school district is making in-lieu-of payments to nonpublic school students who live within 20 miles of the same nonpublic school.

As reported, this bill is identical to A2928 (1R).

## **BILL DESCRIPTION**

Senate Bill No. 2558 of 2001 amends a recently enacted statute, P.L.2000, c.103, which extended eligibility for transportation services to nonpublic school pupils who reside more than 20 miles from their school of attendance and who live in regional school districts composed of only two constituent municipalities. Under that law, if the regional school district was providing transportation to nonpublic school students who lived within the 20 mile radius of the nonpublic school as is normally required for eligibility for nonpublic transportation services, then the regional district would provide transportation or an aid in-lieu-of payment to nonpublic school

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students who resided within the district and lived beyond the 20 mile radius and attended that school. Any cost incurred by a district in implementing that law was to be paid by the State.

This bill requires a regional school district composed of only two municipalities to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments to a nonpublic student residing in the regional school district and attending a nonpublic school which is more than 20 miles from the student's home if that district is providing aid-in-lieu of payments, not just transportation as under current law, to a nonpublic student who resides in the regional district and lives within 20 miles of the student's nonpublic school.

This bill clarifies that the definition of "regional district" includes consolidated districts composed of only two municipalities.

This bill will apply to the 2000-2001 school year so that nonpublic school students who were denied benefits under P.L.2000, c.103 will be entitled to receive those benefits for the current school year.

#### **OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES**

For the reasons given below, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) finds that the cost of Senate Bill No. 2558 of 2001 cannot be determined.

Senate Bill No.2558 of 2001 amends P.L.2000, c.103 which extended eligibility for transportation services to a nonpublic school pupil who resides more than 20 miles from the pupil's school of attendance and who lives in a regional school district composed of only two constituent municipalities if the regional school district provides transportation to a nonpublic student who resides in the regional district remote from the same nonpublic school but not further than 20 miles from that school. According to the Department of Education, the cost of implementing P.L.2000, c.103 was \$49,865.

The table below provides information from the Department of Education concerning the districts affected by Senate Bill No. 2558 of 2001 and the provision of transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for certain nonpublic students.

Under Senate Bill No. 2558 of 2001, there are 34 regional districts that may be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments under certain circumstances. Under current law as implemented by the Department of Education, only the 27 two constituent municipality regional districts are required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments to a pupil living more than 20 miles from the pupil's nonpublic school of attendance, if the district is already providing **transportation** for another pupil who resides not more than 20 miles from the same nonpublic school. Under Senate Bill No. 2558 of 2001, these districts are also required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for another pupil who resides not more than 20 miles from the same nonpublic school.

Senate Bill No. 2558 of 2001 also clarifies that seven two constituent municipality consolidated districts are included under the law's provisions and would have to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments under the same circumstances as two constituent municipality regional districts. Since the Department of Education did not include consolidated districts when it implemented P.L.2000, c.103, the information in the table concerning the provision of transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments refers to pupils living in the consolidated district, remote from a nonpublic school but not further than 20 miles from that school. All consolidated districts provide either transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for these pupils. Therefore under this bill, they would also be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for any other pupil who resides in the district, goes to one of the same nonpublic schools and lives more than 20 miles from that nonpublic school. The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) does not have information on which nonpublic schools are attended by pupils for which the district provides transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments or the number of students living further than 20 miles from those same nonpublic schools for which a consolidated district will be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments.

OLS notes that under P.L.2000, c.103, the situation that triggers the requirement that a district provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for a nonpublic school pupil residing in the district and living more than 20 miles from a nonpublic school is already in place for 26 of the 27 districts and that implementing P.L.2000, c.103 cost the State \$49,865. This bill would amend current law to provide that an aid-in-lieu of payment made for a pupil who resides in the district and attends a nonpublic school not further than 20 miles from the pupil's home would trigger the requirement that a district also provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments for a nonpublic school pupil residing in the district, attending the same nonpublic school and living more than 20 miles from that nonpublic school. OLS does not have information on which nonpublic schools are attended by pupils living within 20 miles of those schools for which the district already provides aid-in-lieu of payments or the number of pupils living further than 20 miles from those same nonpublic schools for which the regional district would be required to provide transportation or aid-in-lieu of payments under this bill.

#### **CHAPTER 324**

**AN ACT** concerning the transportation of nonpublic school pupils in certain regional and consolidated school districts and amending P.L.1999, c.350.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

1. Section 1 of P.L.1999, c.350 (C.18A:39-1.6) is amended to read as follows:

C.18A:39-1.6 Transportation of nonpublic school students, remote, certain.

1. As used in this section, "regional district" means a regional school district composed of only two constituent municipalities or a consolidated school district composed of only two municipalities.

Notwithstanding any provision of N.J.S.18A:39-1 to the contrary, if a school district provides transportation to and from school to a school pupil who resides remote from school and attends a nonpublic school located within the State not more than 20 miles from the residence of the pupil, or in the case of a regional district provides transportation or an in-lieu-of-payment to such pupil, the school district or regional district shall provide transportation, when seats are available on existing routes, or an in-lieu-of payment to all nonpublic school pupils who reside within the municipality of that pupil or in the case of a regional district reside within the district, attend that school, and reside more than 20 miles from that school. The school district may require all nonpublic school pupils in the municipality or regional district to use the bus stops which serve the pupils whose residences are not more than 20 miles from the nonpublic school. Any cost incurred by a school district or a regional district in providing transportation or an in-lieu-of payment under the provisions of this section shall not exceed the maximum cost per pupil established pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1981, c.57 (C.18A:39-1a), and shall be paid by the State.

2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall first apply to the 2000-2001 school year.
