The Assembly Health Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1970.

This bill provides that the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism established pursuant to P.L.1999, c.105 (N.J.S.A.30:6D-56 et seq.) shall be annually appropriated \$1,500,000 from the General Fund.

P.L.1999, c.105 provided for a one-time appropriation of \$1,500,000 to the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism, of which amount: \$600,000 was allocated to the Center of Excellence for Autism (established pursuant to P.L.1999, c.105) for the purpose of conducting basic and clinical research; \$600,000 was allocated to the center for training, information and continuing education programs, participant research and stipends for health care professionals; \$200,000 was allocated for the council administrator's salary; and \$50,000 was allocated for the initiatives established pursuant to P.L.1999, c.105.

While appropriations to ongoing programs are subject to the annual appropriations act, it is the intent and purpose of the sponsor to clarify that the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism should annually be appropriated sufficient funds to continue the work of the council and the purposes set forth in P.L.1999, c.105.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 1970 with committee amendments.

Assembly Bill No. 1970, as amended, provides that the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism, established pursuant to P.L.1999, c.105 (N.J.S.A.30:6D-56 et seq.), shall be annually appropriated \$1,500,000 from the General Fund.

That statute provided for a one-time appropriation of \$1,500,000 to the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism, of which: \$600,000 was allocated to the Center of Excellence for Autism (established pursuant to P.L.1999, c.105) for the purpose of conducting basic and clinical research; \$600,000 was allocated to the center for training, information and continuing education programs, participant research and stipends for health care professionals; \$200,000 was allocated for carrying out research pilot studies; \$50,000 was allocated for the council administrator's salary; and \$50,000 was allocated for the initiatives established pursuant to P.L.1999, c.105.

While appropriations to ongoing programs are subject to the annual appropriations act, it is the intent and purpose of the sponsor to clarify that the Council on Infantile Autism should annually be appropriated sufficient funds to continue its work and the purposes set forth in P.L.1999, c.105.

This bill is identical to Senate Bil No. 1133, now pending before the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This bill will provide for an annual appropriation to the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism in the amount of \$1,500,000.

COMMITTE AMENDMENTS:

The amendments change the effective date to July 1, 2001, the beginning with FY2002, since \$1,500,000 is already provided for in the FY2001 budget act.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1133.

This bill provides that the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism shall be annually appropriated \$1,500,000 from the General Fund.

Legislation enacted in 1999, the "New Jersey Infantile Autism Biomedical Research Act" (N.J.S.A.30:6D-56 et seq.), established the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism in the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey. The legislation included a one-time appropriation to the Council of \$1,500,000. Of this amount: \$600,000 was allocated to the Center of Excellence for Autism to support basic and clinical research; \$600,000 was allocated to the Center for training, information and continuing education programs, participant research and stipends for health care professionals; \$200,000 was allocated for carrying out research pilot studies; \$50,000 was allocated for the Council administrator's salary; and \$50,000 was allocated for the initiatives under the Act.

While appropriations to ongoing programs are subject to the annual appropriations act, the intent of the sponsor of this bill is to clarify that the Council should annually be appropriated sufficient funds to continue its work and the purposes set forth in P.L.1999, c.105.

The provisions of this bill are identical to those of Assembly Bill No. 1970, now on second reading in the General Assembly.

FISCAL IMPACT

This bill directs that an annual appropriation be made to the Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Infantile Autism in the amount of \$1,500,000.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

Committee amendments change the effective date of the legislation from July 1, 2000 to July 1, 2001, since \$1,500,000 is already provided for in the FY2001 appropriations act.
