The bill defines a "child advocacy center" as a county-based center which meets the standards for a multidisciplinary team established by the Commissioner of Human Services and demonstrates a multidisciplinary approach in providing comprehensive, culturally competent child abuse prevention, intervention and treatment services to children who are victims of child abuse or neglect. Under current law, a multidisciplinary team consists of representatives from the disciplines of law enforcement, child protective services, mental health, substance abuse identification and treatment, and medicine.

The committee amended the bill to specifically provide that a county-based multidisciplinary team shall include a staff representative of a child advocacy center in those counties where a child advocacy center has been established.
