[Within thirty days thereafter the] The governor shall, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, appoint a commission 10 consisting of [five] seven members who shall be residents of the 11 12 water supply district which they represent and not more than [three] 13 four of whom shall be of the same political party. The commissioners 14 first appointed shall hold office, one for one year, one for two years, one for three years and two for four years. The two commissioners 15 16 first appointed pursuant to P.L., c. (C.)(now before the 17 Legislature as this bill) shall hold office for four years. Upon the 18 expiration of the term of office of any commissioner, his successor 19 shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent 20 of the senate, for a term of four years. Each commissioner shall hold his office until his successor has been appointed, and any vacancy in 21 22 the membership of the commission shall be filled for the unexpired 23 term in the manner provided for an original appointment. STATEMENT

3 This bill would add two commissioners to the membership of the 4 North Jersey District Water Supply Commission and provides for the submission of the minutes of any meeting of the commission to the 5 Governor. No action taken at the meeting by the commission shall 6 7 have force or effect until 15 days expires from the date of receipt of 8 the minutes by the Governor or until the Governor approves the 9 minutes, whichever comes first. If the Governor vetoes any action 10 taken by the commission or any member thereof during the 15-day period, the action shall be null and of no effect. 11

The Senate Environment Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1117.

As amended, this bill would add two commissioners to the membership of the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission.

The committee amendment would delete the provision that would have provided for the Governor's review and possible veto of the commission's minutes. Current law does not provide for the Governor's review of commission meeting minutes.

AN ACT concerning certain water supply districts in the State of New Jersey, and amending R.S.58:5-3.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

Appointment of commissioners; terms; vacancies.

58:5-3. The governor shall, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, appoint a commission consisting of seven members who shall be residents of the water supply district which they represent and not more than four of whom shall be of the same political party. The commissioners first appointed shall hold office, one for one year, one for two years, one for three years and two for four years. The two commissioners first appointed pursuant to P.L.2001, c.374 shall hold office for four years. Upon the expiration of the term of office of any commissioner, his successor shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, for a term of four years. Each commissioner shall hold his office until his successor has been appointed, and any vacancy in the membership of the commission shall be filled for the unexpired term in the manner provided for an original appointment. If the senate is not in session at the time of making any such appointment, the governor may make an ad interim appointment for a time extending only until such time as the senate shall convene.
