The Senate Health Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 1584.

This bill requires the Commissioner of Health and Senior Services to establish guidelines, which the commissioner shall recommend for adoption by all State agencies, with respect to the placement of automated external defibrillators in State buildings in order to improve survival rates for individuals who experience cardiac arrest while working or conducting business in one of those buildings.

This bill is intended as a follow-up measure to the enactment of P.L.1999, c.34 (N.J.S.A.2A:62A-23 et seq.), which was designed to encourage greater acquisition, deployment and use of automated external defibrillators by trained users of these devices throughout the State by protecting these users and their employers from civil liability for any personal injury resulting from their use of the defibrillators. This bill parallels provisions in recently enacted federal law, Pub.L.106-505, that requires the federal Secretary of Health and Human Services to establish guidelines with respect to the placement of automated external defibrillators in federal buildings.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2873 (Blee/Gibson), which is on second reading in the General Assembly.
