The Senate Education Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 592.

As amended, this bill provides that the board of education of a school district or the board of trustees of a charter school which establishes an Internet web site may not disclose on that web site any personally identifiable information about a student without receiving prior written consent on a form from the student's parent or guardian. The written consent form would be developed by the Department of Education and would contain a statement concerning the potential dangers of displaying personally identifiable information about individual students on the Internet.

The bill defines personally identifiable information to mean student names, student photos, student addresses, student e-mail addresses, student phone numbers, and locations and times of class trips.

An amendment was adopted which revised the definition of personally identifiable information.

CHAPTER 402

As used in this act, "personally identifiable information" means student names, student photos, student addresses, student e-mail addresses, student phone numbers, and locations and times of class trips.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.
