### 4 STATEMENT

Under this bill, a person who causes the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer in violation of N.J.S.2C:29-2 (resisting arrest; eluding officer) commits aggravated manslaughter. The bill specifies that aggravated manslaughter in this context is a crime of the first degree. First-degree crimes are punishable by a term of imprisonment of 10 to 20 years, a fine of up to \$200,000, or both. It is the sponsor's belief that the court will impose a presumptive sentence of 15 years pursuant to subsection f. of N.J.S.2C:44-1 for a violation under the bill. Persons who commit first-degree aggravated manslaughter by recklessly causing death under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to human life are subject to an ordinary term of imprisonment of 10 to 30 years.

Currently, causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer in violation of N.J.S.2C:29-2 (resisting arrest; eluding officer) constitutes manslaughter under N.J.S.2C:11-4. Manslaughter is a crime of the second degree. Normally, second-degree crimes are punishable by a term of imprisonment of five to 10 years, a fine of up to \$150,000, or both. However, an enhanced term of imprisonment of five to 15 years may be imposed for this crime.

The bill also specifies that a passenger in a motor vehicle cannot "cause" the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer.

The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2407.

Assembly Bill No. 2407 amends N.J.S.2C:11-4 to upgrade the crime of causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer in violation of N.J.S.2C:29-2 from manslaughter to aggravated manslaughter.

The bill specifies that causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer in violation of N.J.S.2C:29-2 is a crime of the first degree. First-degree crimes are punishable by a term of imprisonment of 10 to 20 years, a fine of up to \$200,000, or both. It is the sponsor's understanding that the court will impose, pursuant to subsection f. of N.J.S.2C:44-1, a presumptive sentence of 15 years upon a person convicted of causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer.

The bill also specifies that a passenger in a motor vehicle cannot "cause" the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer.

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2407.

This bill amends N.J.S.2C:11-4 to upgrade the crime of causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer in violation of N.J.S.2C:29-2 from manslaughter to aggravated manslaughter.

The bill specifies that causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer in violation of N.J.S.2C:29-2 is a crime of the first degree. First-degree crimes are punishable by a term of imprisonment of 10 to 20 years, a fine of up to \$200,000, or both. It is the sponsor's understanding that the court will impose, pursuant to subsection f. of N.J.S.2C:44-1, a presumptive sentence of 15 years upon a person convicted of causing the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer.

The bill also specifies that a passenger in a motor vehicle cannot "cause" the death of another while fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer.

This bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1623, which also was released by the committee on this date.

  - (1) It is committed recklessly; or
- (2) A homicide which would otherwise be murder under section 2C:11-3 is committed in the heat of passion resulting from a reasonable provocation.

Aggravated manslaughter under paragraph (1) of subsection a. of this section is a crime of the first degree and upon conviction thereof a person may, notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of subsection a. of N.J.S.2C:43-6, be sentenced to an ordinary term of imprisonment between 10 and 30 years. Aggravated manslaughter under paragraph (2) of subsection a. of this section is a crime of the first degree. Manslaughter is a crime of the second degree.
