This bill establishes a scholarship program for the children of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. More than 300 New Jersey law enforcement officers have been killed in the line of duty, about half of whom have been killed since 1960. This bill is intended to honor these officers.

It would provide tuition assistance to their children who attend New Jersey institutions of higher learning. The scholarship program would be administered by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority in, but not of, the Department of State. This program would be funded by the sale of special license plates honoring the fallen officers. Each set of plates will bear an additional application fee of \$50 to support the scholarship program.

Children of State and local police, correctional officers and federal law enforcement officers would be eligible for the scholarships.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2000 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review which has been performed.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 165.

This bill establishes a scholarship program for the surviving children of certain New Jersey law enforcement officers.

The program would provide assistance for undergraduate study at a public or private institution of higher education in New Jersey to the children of New Jersey law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty. The bill defines "law enforcement officer" as

a New Jersey resident employed as a permanent full-time member of any federal, State, county or municipal law enforcement agency, department, or division of those governments who is statutorily empowered to act for the detection, investigation, arrest, conviction, detention, or rehabilitation of persons violating the criminal laws of this State or of the United States and statutorily required to successfully complete a training course approved by the Police Training Commission . . . or certified by the commission as being substantially equivalent to an approved course.

The scholarship program would be administered by the New Jersey Higher Education Student Assistance Authority. The amount of any scholarship could not exceed the portion of a recipient's cost of attendance, at the particular undergraduate institution in which the recipient is enrolled, that is not otherwise covered by other student aid programs administered by the authority. Selection of recipients could take into account their relative need and means.

The program would be funded by the sale of special license plates honoring the deceased officers. The license plates are to be designed by the Superintendent of State Police in consultation with the State Police Benevolent Asociation, the State Fraternal Order of Police, and the staff of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc. (a nonprofit organization dedicated to increasing support for the law enforcement profession by commemorating the service of law enforcement officers). The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles is to be responsible for approving the design and issuing the plates.

Each set of plates would be subject to an initial application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10, both fees in addition to the regular fees prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

Committee amendments to the bill (1) provide for coordination of scholarship awards under the legislation with student aid under other programs administered by the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority, and (2) make various technical changes to correct references and clarify the wording of the legislation.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Division of Motor Vehicles has previously estimated that "cause" plates (e.g. Shore Protection, Animal Friendly, Cancer Research, etc.) generate the following costs: (1) about \$12 per set to produce and issue the plates; (2) about \$46,000 for marketing inserts advertising the availability of the plates; and (3) about \$30,000 for one-time computer programming expenses. Assuming an initial production run of 5,000 plates costing about \$60,000, and adding one-time costs of \$76,000 for marketing and computer-related activities, the indicated total first-year cost of issuing the special law enforcement memorial plates would be about \$136,000.

To offset these State costs, the division would receive the revenues from the \$50 application fee and the \$10 renewal fee. If all 5,000 license plates in the initial production run were issued in the first year, the State would receive \$250,000 in revenue that year. The allocation of \$136,000 from that revenue to reimburse the division for its startup costs would leave \$114,000 available for student aid in the first year of the scholarship program. (For purposes of comparison, it is noted that the Higher Education Student Assistance Authority received an appropriation of \$65,000 in FY2000 to support the survivors tuition benefits program, which also offers higher education assistance to survivors of law enforcement personnel.)

Future State costs and contributions to the fund would be dependent on the actual demand for these plates.

Therefore, given an initial production run of 5,000 plates costing about \$60,000 and one-time costs of \$76,000 for marketing and computer related activities, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) estimates a total first-year cost of \$136,000 to begin issuance of these special law enforcement memorial plates.

To offset these State costs, the division would receive the revenues from the \$50 application fee, and the \$10 renewal fee. If the entire 5,000 initial license plate production run was issued in the first year, the State would receive \$250,000 in revenue. The subsequent allocation of \$136,000 from that revenue to reimburse the division for its startup costs would make \$114,000 available for deposit in the "Law Enforcement Memorial Fund."

Disregarding probable interest by the general public, if only 10 percent of the members of these two police retirement systems were to purchase the special plates, then an initial production run of 5,000 plate sets could be sold the first year.

a New Jersey resident employed as a permanent full-time member of any federal, State, county or municipal law enforcement agency, department, or division of those governments who is statutorily empowered to act for the detection, investigation, arrest, conviction, detention, or rehabilitation of persons violating the criminal laws of this State or of the United States and statutorily required to successfully complete a training course approved by the Police Training Commission . . . or certified by the commission as being substantially equivalent to an approved course.

The scholarship program would be administered by the New Jersey Higher Education Student Assistance Authority. The amount of any scholarship could not exceed the portion of a recipient's cost of attendance, at the particular undergraduate institution in which the recipient is enrolled, that is not otherwise covered by other student aid programs administered by the authority. Selection of recipients could take into account their relative need and means.

The program would be funded by the sale of special license plates honoring the deceased officers, the receipts from which would be deposited into a "Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Fund," in the Department of the Treasury, created pursuant to this bill. The license plates are to be designed by the Superintendent of State Police in consultation with the State Police Benevolent Association, the State Fraternal Order of Police, and the staff of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc. (a nonprofit organization

dedicated to increasing support for the law enforcement profession by commemorating the service of law enforcement officers). The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles is to be responsible for approving the design and issuing the plates.

Each set of plates would be subject to an initial application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10, both fees in addition to the regular fees prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles.

The committee amended the bill to require that the State Police Benevolent Association, the State Fraternal Order of Police, and the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc. contribute an amount, as determined by the director, but not to exceed an aggregate amount of \$50,000, that is to be used to initially produce and issue the license plates. In addition, other law enforcement organizations and donors could assist by contributing monies to any of the three organizations listed herein for the purposes noted. Receipts from the license plate fees would first be used: (1) to reimburse the organizations contributing the amount needed to offset the noted initial costs of the division; (2) then to reimburse the division for additional costs incurred to continue to produce and issue the special memorial license plates and the Department of Transportation for certain administrative expenses; and (3) then to support the scholarship program for children of New Jersey law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

The Attorney General shall annually report the Department of Law and Public Safety's costs and the division's costs to the Office of Management and Budget.

For the purposes of this act, "law enforcement officer" means a New Jersey resident employed as a permanent full-time member of any federal, State, county or municipal law enforcement agency, department, or division of those governments who is statutorily empowered to act for the detection, investigation, arrest, conviction, detention, or rehabilitation of persons violating the criminal laws of this State or of the United States and statutorily required to successfully complete a training course approved by the Police Training Commission pursuant to P.L.1961, c.56 (C.52:17B-66 et seq.), or certified by the commission as being substantially equivalent to an approved course.

5. The Executive Director of Student Assistance Programs in the Office of Student Assistance shall adopt rules and regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.

6. This act shall take effect on the first day of the seventh month after enactment; except the Attorney General, the State Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may take such action in advance of the effective date as may be necessary for the timely implementation of this act.

STATEMENT

 This bill establishes a scholarship program for the children of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. More than 300 New Jersey law enforcement officers have been killed in the line of duty, about half of whom have been killed since 1960. This bill is intended to honor these officers.

It would provide tuition assistance to their children who attend New Jersey institutions of higher learning. The scholarship program would be administered by the Office of Student Assistance in but not of, the Department of The Treasury. This program would be funded by the sale of special license plates honoring the fallen officers. Each set of plates will bear an additional application fee of \$50 to support the scholarship program.

Children of State and local police, correctional officers and federal law enforcement officers would be eligible for the scholarships.

The Assembly Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1211.

This bill establishes a scholarship program for the surviving children of certain New Jersey law enforcement officers.

The program would provide assistance for undergraduate study at a public or private institution of higher education in New Jersey to the children of New Jersey law enforcement officers who are killed in the line of duty. The bill defines "law enforcement officer" as

a New Jersey resident employed as a permanent full-time member of any federal, State, county or municipal law enforcement agency, department, or division of those governments who is statutorily empowered to act for the detection, investigation, arrest, conviction, detention, or rehabilitation of persons violating the criminal laws of this State or of the United States and statutorily required to successfully complete a training course approved by the Police Training Commission . . . or certified by the commission as being substantially equivalent to an approved course.

The scholarship program would be administered by the New Jersey Higher Education Student Assistance Authority. The amount of any scholarship could not exceed the portion of a recipient's cost of attendance, at the particular undergraduate institution in which the recipient is enrolled, that is not otherwise covered by other student aid programs administered by the authority. Selection of recipients could take into account their relative need and means.

The program would be funded by the sale of special license plates honoring the deceased officers, the receipts from which would be deposited into a "Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Fund," in the Department of the Treasury, created pursuant to this bill. The license plates are to be designed by the Superintendent of State Police in consultation with the State Police Benevolent Association, the State Fraternal Order of Police, and the staff of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc. (a nonprofit organization dedicated to increasing support for the law enforcement profession by

commemorating the service of law enforcement officers). The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles is to be responsible for approving the design and issuing the plates.

Each set of plates would be subject to an initial application fee of \$50 and an annual renewal fee of \$10, both fees in addition to the regular fees prescribed by law for the registration of motor vehicles.

The committee amended the bill to: (1) provide for coordination of scholarship awards with student aid under other programs administered by the Higher Educational Student Assistance Authority; (2) make various technical changes to correct references and clarify the wording of the legislation; and (3) require that the State Police Benevolent Association, the State Fraternal Order of Police, and the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc. contribute an amount, as determined by the director, but not to exceed an aggregate amount of \$50,000, that is to be used to initially produce and issue the license plates. In addition, other law enforcement organizations and donors could assist by contributing monies to any of the three organizations listed herein for the purposes noted. Receipts from license plate fees would first be used: (1) to reimburse the organizations contributing the amount needed to offset the initial costs of the division; (2) then to reimburse the division for additional costs incurred to continue to produce and issue the special memorial license plates; and the Department of Transportation for certain administrative expenses, and (3) then to support the scholarship program for children of New Jersey law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

Assembly Bill No. 1211 as amended by the committee is identical to Senate Bill No. 165(1R) as amended and reported by the committee today.

Technical review was performed on this pre-filed bill, and the changes required by technical review have been made, as required under Joint Rule 18A of the Senate and General Assembly.

BILL DESCRIPTION

Assembly Bill No. 1211 (1R) of 2000 authorizes the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue special license plates to commemorate and honor law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty in New Jersey. Law enforcement associations sponsoring the issuance of these plates would contribute an amount, not to exceed \$50,000, to cover DMV startup costs associated with the production, issuance and advertisement of the availability of the special plates.

There would be an application fee of \$50 for the special plates and an annual renewal fee of \$10. These fees are in addition to fees otherwise charged for vehicle registration. The application and renewal fees would be used to: (1) reimburse the law enforcement associations for their contribution to cover DMV startup costs; (2) provide the division with additional monies needed for any further production and issuance costs of the special law enforcement memorial plates; and (3) capitalize the "Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Fund" which is established by this bill to provide financial assistance for undergraduate study at a public or private institution of higher education in New Jersey by children of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The Division of Motor Vehicles currently estimates that "cause" plates, e.g. Shore Protection, Animal Friendly, Cancer Research, etc. have the following costs: (1) about \$6 per set to produce; (2) about \$10,000 for marketing inserts and advertisements to alert drivers of the availability of new "cause" plates; and (3) about \$10,000 for one-time computer programming expenses. Therefore, given an initial production run of 5,000 plates costing about \$30,000 and expenses of \$20,000 for marketing and computer related activities, the Office of Legislative Services (OLS) estimates an initial first-year cost of \$50,000 to produce and issue these special law enforcement memorial plates.

To offset these initial State costs, the division would receive the \$50,000 contribution from the sponsoring law enforcement associations to cover the estimated startup costs. In addition, the division would begin to receive revenues from the \$50 application fee, and the \$10 renewal fee. If an entire 5,000 initial license plate production run was issued in the first year, the State would receive \$250,000 in revenue. The subsequent allocation of \$50,000 from that revenue to reimburse the law enforcement associations for their contribution for DMV startup costs would make \$200,000 available for deposit in the "Law Enforcement Memorial Fund."

Future State costs and contributions to the fund would be dependent on the actual demand for these plates. Although OLS cannot estimate this demand, OLS would note that there are over 45,000 members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System of New Jersey who have a police affiliation. There are also about 4,300 members of the State Police Retirement System of New Jersey. Disregarding probable interest by the general public, if only 10 percent of the

members of these two police retirement systems were to purchase the special plates, then an initial production run of 5,000 plate sets could be sold the first year.

CHAPTER 41

AN ACT authorizing law enforcement officer memorial license plates, supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes and subtitle 12A of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

C.18A:71B-24.1 Short title.

1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Law Enforcement Officers' Memorial Scholarship Act of 2000."

C.39:3-27.123 Law enforcement officer memorial license plates; "Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Fund."

- 2. a. The Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles may issue for a motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in the State special license plates bearing, in addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, an appropriate slogan and an emblem, to be designed by the Superintendent of State Police, in consultation with the State Police Benevolent Association, the State Fraternal Order of Police and the staff of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc., and approved by the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles. killed in the line of duty in New Jersey. To help offset the initial costs incurred by the division for the special license plates authorized by this act, other law enforcement organizations and donors may assist by contributing monies to any of the three organizations listed herein. Any amount remaining after the payment of the initial costs shall be returned to the three contributing organizations.

C.39:3-27.125 Use of appropriated funds.

- 4. Funds from the Law Enforcement Officer Memorial Fund shall be annually appropriated first to reimburse the amount contributed by those organizations pursuant to section 3 of this act, and then:
- a. to reimburse the Division of Motor Vehicles for all costs, including those costs associated with computer programming changes, incurred in producing, issuing, renewing and publicizing the availability of law enforcement officer memorial license plates;
- b. to reimburse the Department of Transportation for the design and printing of notices, posters and signs to be utilized by the Division of Motor Vehicles; and
- c. for the establishment of a scholarship program for the children of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty pursuant to section 5 of this act.

The amount of any such scholarship shall not exceed an amount equal to the portion of the recipient's cost of attendance at the institution that is not otherwise covered by any other scholarship, tuition aid grant, benefit or other assistance awarded to the recipient under the "Higher Education Student Assistance Authority Law," N.J.S.18A:71A-1 et seq.
- c. The scholarships may be renewed annually for up to four years, except that each scholarship shall remain in effect only if the holder of the scholarship remains a full-time student in good standing at the institution and continues to meet the eligibility criteria and guidelines established under this act and regulations promulgated thereto. Selection of recipients may take into account the actual dependency of the recipients, their needs and means, and the pecuniary loss occasioned by reason of the death of their parents.
- d. A student who is subject to the provisions of the "Military Selective Service Act," 50 U.S.C. App.453, shall not be eligible to receive any scholarship without verification of compliance with the requirements of that act.

DiFransesco Honors Families of Slain Law Enforcement Officers Signs Bill Creating Scholarship Fund for Children of Law Enforcement Officers Killed in the Line of Duty

Acting Governor Donald T. DiFrancesco today signed legislation authorizing state license plates to raise college scholarship funds for the children of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. The bill signing followed a Blue Mass memorial service at the Cathedral of St. Mary in Trenton in honor of these fallen heroes.

"This license plate-the first in the nation to recognize law enforcement - will pay tribute to those who died in the line of duty and remind us that public safety carries a high price. It is great relief for the families of college-bound children, but it's also a quiet tribute and a daily reminder," remarked DiFrancesco.

"The scholarships will go a long way to relieve the pressure on families who have already sacrificed so much," continued DiFrancesco.

The proceeds from the sale of the newly created license plates, which carry an additional \$50 application fee, will be used for college scholarships for the children of state and local police, correctional officers and federal law enforcement officers provided the students are enrolled in a New Jersey college or university. The State Police Benevolent Association (PBA), State Fraternal Order of Police (FOP), and the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc. will jointly contribute \$50,000 to offset the initial costs of producing the plates.

The Acting Governor recognized Maureen King and Lieutenant Jim Wan Etten of the Belmar Police Department for their efforts in support of the law-enforcement plates. Mrs. King championed the bill in honor of her late husband, Long Branch Sergeant Patrick King, who was killed in the line of duty.

The legislation, S-165, was sponsored by Senators Joe Palaia (R-Monmouth) and John Matheussen (R-Camden/Gloucester), and Assemblymen Steve Corodemus (R-Monmouth) and Guy Talarico (R-Bergen). It was also supported by the New Jersey PBA and FOP, in addition to two associations comprised of survivors of those killed in the line of duty -- Garden State COPS and Survivors of the Triangle.
