The Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2754.

As amended by the committee, this bill would prohibit the construction and operation of a crematorium without the prior approval of the governing body of the municipality in which the crematorium would be located. The governing body could grant its approval only upon a determination, after a public hearing, that the construction and operation of the crematorium would not be a substantial detriment to the public good. The governing body of the cemetery would be responsible for the costs of providing notice of a hearing.

The committee amended the bill to ensure that the bill would apply to all cemeteries in New Jersey, regardless of their type of ownership or method of organization. The amendments also clarify that, under the bill, a municipal governing body would be allowed to assess the governing body of a cemetery a fee for providing notice of the public hearing required under the bills provisions.

The Assembly Local Government Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 3950.

This bill, as amended by the committee, would require approval by a municipal governing body for the construction and operation of a crematorium within its municipal boundaries. The municipal governing body could grant its approval only upon a determination, after a hearing, that the construction and operation of the crematorium would not be a substantial detriment to the public good of the The cemetery proposing to build or operate the community. crematorium would be responsible for the reasonable costs of providing notice of a hearing on its application for approval. The committee amended the bill to correctly identify the party responsible for paying the reasonable costs of notice for the hearing and to remove the word "company" from the phrase, "cemetery company" so as not to limit the requirements of the bill to for-profit cemetery companies. The committee believes that the amended wording would make the bill applicable to every cemetery operating within the State, whether forprofit, religious or not-for-profit.
