# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED NOVEMBER 19, 1984

By Senators FELDMAN and Dumont

Referred to Committee on Education

AN ACT to establish the New Jersey State College Governing Boards Association, supplementing Chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, amending N. J. S. 18A:3-6, and repealing Article 2 of Chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. (New section) There is established a body corporate and 2 politic, with corporate succession to be known as the New Jersey 3 State College Governing Boards Association. The State colleges 4 shall be members of the association.

2. (New section) The association shall consist of nine voting members to be appointed as follows: one member from each of the State college boards of trustees, appointed by the members thereof. In addition, the Chancellor of Higher Education and the presidents of the State colleges shall serve as ex officio nonvoting members. Members shall serve without compensation but shall be entitled

7 to be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses.

1 3. (New section) The association shall select such officers and 2 make such rules as may be necessary for the transaction of business.

4. (New section) The association shall have perpetual succession
 and shall have the following powers and responsibilities:

3 a. To make, amend and repeal rules, regulations and bylaws for

4 its own government and guidance not inconsistent with the pur-5 poses of the association;

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter printed in italics *thus* is new matter. 6 b. To adopt an official seal and alter the same at pleasure;

c. To maintain an office at such place or places in the State as it8 may designate;

9 d. To sue and be sued in its own name;

e. To borrow money, to issue bonds or notes therefor, and to
secure the same by pledge or mortgage of its real and personal
property, but it shall not in any manner, directly or indirectly,
pledge the credit of the State; and

f. To acquire, hold and dispose of real and personal property
in the exercise of its powers and the performance of its duties
under this article. All this property shall be exempt from taxation
under chapter 4 of Title 54 of the Revised Statutes.

5. (New section) The association shall employ an executive director who shall be responsible for the administration of all the activities of the association including staff services. The executive director shall serve at the pleasure of the association. Within the limits of funds appropriated or otherwise made available for this purpose, the salary of the executive director and all other personnel shall be determined by the association.

6. (New section) The association shall encourage and aid all movements for the improvement of State college education and shall, from time to time, make recommendations to the Board of Higher Education regarding the coordination of the State colleges on matters of mutual interest and concern.

7. (New section) For purposes of defraying the expenses of the 1 association, the State colleges shall pay the necessary expenses 2incurred by the members and shall appropriate annually such sums 3 for dues as may be assessed by the association. The assessment 4  $\mathbf{5}$ shall be made only upon a two-thirds vote of the membership present at the meeting, after notice of the taking of that vote shall 6 have been given to each State college in writing at least 60 days 7 before the meeting of the association. Dues shall be assessed upon 8 a graduated scale according to the size of the State college. 9

1 8. N. J. S. 18A:3-6 is amended to read as follows:

18A:3-6. The Board of Higher Education shall be composed of  $\mathbf{2}$ 3 the Chairman of the Board of Governors of Rutgers, The State 4 University; the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Newark College of Engineering; the Chairman of the [Council of] New 5 Jersey State [Colleges] College Governing Boards Association; 6 the Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the [College] University 7 of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey; the Chairman of the 8 Council of County Colleges; the President of the State Board of 9 10 Education; a representative of the private colleges and universities

of New Jersey, to be designated by the association of independent
colleges and universities in New Jersey, with the approval of the
Governor; and nine citizens, residents of the State, of whom at least
two shall be women. The chancellor and the State Commissioner
of Education shall ex officio be additional members but without vote.
9. Article 2 of Chapter 64 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes
(N. J. A. S. 18A :64-22 through N. J. S. 18A :64-25) is repealed.

1 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1985.
