Governor Thomas H. Kean has signed the following bills:

A-3205, sponsored by Assemblyman Louis F. Kosco, R-Bergen, which appropriates \$20,000 to the Division of Veterans Services in the Department of Human Services to defray expenses for the National Convention of Italian American War Veterans, which will be held in Teaneck, August 8-11, 1985.

A-1946, sponsored by Assemblywoman Marlene Ford, D-Ocean, which permits the use of anatomically correct dolls, models or similar items to assist a child witness' testimony in a sexual offense prosecution.
