AN ACT concerning the taking of striped bass and amending P. L. 1983, c. 506.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 2 of P. L. 1983, c. 506 (C. 23:5-44) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 2. As used in this act:

4 a. *["Goggle fishing" means the taking of striped bass in the 5 Atlantic ocean and the ocean side of any inlet jetties by means of 6 a spear, harpoon or other missile hand held and hand propelled 7 while completely submerged in the water;]* *(Deleted by amend-7A ment, P. L. 1985. c.).*

8 b. "Marine waters" means all the salt waters of this State, 9 including the waters of the Atlantic ocean, and all bays, inlets and 10 estaurine waters located below the fresh water portion of any 11 river, stream or creek, but shall not include any of the fresh waters 12 of this State as defined in R. S. 23:1-2;

c. ["Spawning waters" means for the Delaware river and bay 13 those waters of the State south of an imaginary line drawn from 14 15the Delaware-Pennsylvania border to Birch creek in Gloucester county to an imaginary line drawn from Cape May Point in New 16 Jersey to Cape Henlopen in Delaware and the tributaries of the 17Delaware river and bay to the freshwater license line and for the 18 Hudson river, the Raritan river and Raritan and Sandy Hook 19 bays, "spawning waters" means the waters of the Hudson river, 20 21Kill Van Kull, Arthur Kill, Newark bay, Raritan river, Raritan bay and Sandy Hook bay extending from the New Jersey-New 22EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. d. "Spear" means a long handled instrument with a sharp point or multiple points, often barbed, capable of being thrust into a fish and used for the purpose of taking a fish that was not first hooked and brought near the fisherman by angling with hook and line;

e. "Striped bass" means a game fish of the species "Morone
saxatilis" commonly referred to as rockfish, rock or striper.

1 2. Section 4 of P. L. 1983, c. 506 (C. 23:5-46) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 4. No person shall take from the marine waters of the State in any one day or have in his possession at any time more than [10] 4 five striped bass [, provided that no person shall take, catch, kill $\mathbf{5}$ or have in possession at any time any striped bass measuring less $\mathbf{6}$ 7 than 18 inches in length, or have in his possession while on or angling in the marine waters of this State other than the spawning 8 9 waters more than four striped bass nor any striped bass measuring less than 24 inches. 10

11 The possession of any striped bass or parts of a striped bass 12 from which the head or tail has been removed other than imme-13 diately prior to preparation or being served as food, which is less 14 than [18]24 inches shall be presumed to be possessed in violation 15 of this section.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

This bill would amend the "Striped Bass Act," P. L. 1983, c. 506 to reduce the present 10 fish "catch" limit to a five fish limit. The bill would also prohibit the taking of any striped bass of less than 24 inches rather than permit a certain number of the catch in "non-spawning waters" to be under 24 inches but greater than 18 inches.

Enactment of this bill will serve as the "linchpin" in the State's argument that the annual striped bass catch will be reduced by 55%. If the United States Marine Fisheries Commission agrees that the catch will indeed be reduced by that amount, New Jersey would not be subject to a moratorium on all striped bass fishing in the State imposed pursuant to the "Atlantic Striped Bass Conservation Act," a federal statute signed by the President on October 31, 1984.

This bill would amend the "Striped Bass Act," P. L. 1983, c. 506 to reduce the present ten fish "catch" limit to a five fish limit. The bill would also prohibit the taking of any striped bass of less than 24 inches rather than permit a certain number of the catch in "non-spawning waters" to be under 24 inches but greater than 18 inches.

The Senate Natural Resources and Agricultural Committee amended the bill to permit the use of spearguns for the taking of striped bass while completely submerged in marine waters. 28d. *["Spear" means a long handled instrument with a sharp 29point or multiple points, often barbed, capable of being thrust 30 into a fish and used for the purpose of taking a fish that was not first hooked and brought near the fisherman by angling with hook 31and line]* *"Spearfishing" means the taking of striped bass by 3233 means of a spear, harpoon, or other missile, while the swimmer is completely submerged in marine waters, but shall not include the 34use of blinding lights for the purpose of spearing striped bass, or 35spears, harpoons or other missiles with exploding heads*; 36

e. "Striped bass" means a game fish of the species "Moronesaxatilis" commonly referred to as rockfish, rock or striper.

1 2. Section 4 of P. L. 1983, c. 506 (C. 23:5-46) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 4. No person shall take from the marine waters of the State in 4 any one day^{*},^{*} or ^{*}sell, barter, offer for sale or barter or^{*} have in his possession at any time^{*},^{*} more than [10] five striped bass[, 56 provided that no person shall take, catch, kill or have in possession 7 at any time any striped bass measuring less than 18 inches in 8 length, or have in his possession while on or angling in the marine 9 waters of this State other than the spawning waters more than 10four striped bass] nor any striped bass measuring less than 24 10_A inches.

11 The possession of any striped bass or parts of a striped bass 12 from which the head or tail has been removed other than imme-13 diately prior to preparation or being served as food, which is less 14 than [18]24 inches shall be presumed to be possessed in violation 15 of this section.

*3. Section 5 of P. L. 1983, c. 506 (C. 23:5-47) is amended to read
as follows:

5. No person shall take, catch or kill a striped bass from or in any of the marine waters of this State by means of a net or by any method other than by hook and line or by [goggle fishing] *spearfishing* as defined. Nothing in this section shall preclude the use of a landing net or gaff in landing a striped bass caught on hook and line, except that it shall be unlawful to foul hook striped bass.*

1 ***[3.]*** *4.* This act shall take effect immediately.
