AN ACT concerning the use of reflectors for lane markers and supplementing Title 27 of the Revised Statutes***[** and making an appropriation therefor**]***

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary,
2 whenever any repair, construction, reconstruction or resurfacing
3 is undertaken by the Department of Transportation on any road
4 under its jurisdiction, the Department of Transportation shall
5 wherever practical and subject to available funding, imbed reflectors
6 into the surface of that road to be used as lane markers.

1 ***[**2. There is appropriated \$1,500,000.00 from the General Fund
2 to the Department of Transportation to effectuate the purposes of
3 this act.**]***

1 ***[**3.**]*** *2.* This act shall take effect ***[**on the 180th day after
2 enactment**]*** *immediately.**

AN ACT concerning the use of reflectors for lane markers and supplementing Title 27 of the Revised Statutes, and making an appropriation therefor.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary,
2 whenever any repair, construction, reconstruction or resurfacing
3 is undertaken by the Department of Transportation on any road
4 under its jurisdiction, the Department of Transportation shall
5 wherever practical and subject to available funding, imbed reflec-
6 tors into the surface of that road to be used as lane markers.

1 2. There is appropriated \$1,500,000.00 from the General Fund
2 to the Department of Transportation to effectuate the purposes of
3 this act.

1 3. This act shall take effect on the 180th day after enactment.

STATEMENT

This bill requires the Department of Transportation to imbed reflectors, wherever practical and subject to available funding into the surface of a road it repairs, constructs, reconstructs or resurfaces to be used as lane markers.

Many people, especially older people, have difficulty seeing at night. Visual aids, such as reflectors, will help these people to drive more safely.

DATED: APRIL 23, 1984

This bill requires the Department of Transportation to imbed reflectors, wherever practical and subject to available funding, into the surface of any road under its jurisdiction whenever it undertakes any repair, construction, reconstruction or resurfacing of such a road. The reflectors are to be used as lane markers.

The committee removed the appropriations provision in this bill calling for the use of State funds inasmuch as the Department of Transportation has received federal funding to be used for this type of program. The department intends to spend \$1,200,000.00 of federal funds this year to imbed reflectors in State roadways.
