## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JUNE 18, 1984

By Senators DiFRANCESCO, CARDINALE, O'CONNOR, FORAN and JACKMAN

Referred to Committee on Labor, Industry and Professions

AN ACT changing the number of members on the Board of Pharmacy and amending R. S. 45:14-1.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 45:14-1 is amended to read as follows:

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45:14-1. The board of pharmacy of the State of New Jersey,  $\mathbf{2}$ 3 hereinafter in this chapter designated as the "board", established 4 by an act entitled "An act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in this State," approved March nimeteenth, one thousand nine hundred  $\mathbf{5}$ and one (L. 1901, c. 51, p. 85), as amended and supplemented, is 6 7continued. The board shall consist of [five] nine members, [to] 8 two of whom shall be public members and one of whom shall be a State executive department member appointed pursuant to the pro-9 visions of P. L. 1971, c. 60 (C. 45:1-2.1 et seq.). Each of the remain-10 ing six members shall be appointed from time to time as herein-11 after directed [,] by the governor, [each of whom] shall be a citizen 12of and an able and skilled registered pharmacist in this State, shall 13have been registered as a pharmacist in this State for at least five 14years prior to his appointment, shall be actually engaged in conduct-15 ing a pharmacy at the time of his appointment and shall continue in 16 the practice of pharmacy during the term of his office. No member 17 shall be a teacher or instructor in any college of pharmacy. Upon 18 the expiration of the term of office of a member, his successor shall 19 be appointed by the Governor for a term of five years from June 20first of the year in which the term of such former member expired, 21 EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter printed in italics thus is new matter.

22and the [term] terms of not more than [one member] two members 23who are registered pharmacists shall expire in any year. Any vacancy in the membership of the board shall be filled for the un-24expired term in the manner provided for an original appointment; 25and the New Jersey Pharmaceutical Association may annually send 2627to the Governor the names of [three] four registered pharmacists engaged in the practice of pharmacy in this State and having the 2829qualifications required by this section, one of whom the Governor 30may appoint to fill any vacancy occurring in the board.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill adds one more registered pharmacist member to the Board of Pharmacy. At present there are five registered pharmacist members on the board. This bill also clarifies that two members of the public and one State executive department member were added to the board by P. L. 1971, c. 60 (C. 45:1-2.1 et seq.), as amended by P. L. 1977, c. 285.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This bill adds one more registered pharmacist member to the Board of Pharmacy. The Board of Pharmacy with this addition will have a total of nine members consisting of six registered pharmacists, two public members and a State executive department member. HLL S-485, ET. AL. 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Other bills signed by the Governor are:

 $\underline{S-296}$ , sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, R-Warren, which prohibits nunicipalities from assessing construction permit fees on the installation or literation of solar energy heating or cooling systems.

<u>S-1143</u>, sponsored by Senator Wynona Lipman, D-Essex, to appropriate 423,484 to provide one time State grants to loan agencies that are recipients of federal Community Services block grants. The bill restricts the grants to those agencies whose funding cycle begins on October, November or December and requires them to move the starting date of their fiscal year to January 1.

<u>S-1365</u>, sponsored by Senator John Russo, D-Ocean, to provide that county welfare agencies shall handle interstate child support petitions and proceedings.

<u>S-1923</u>, sponsored by Senator Donald DiFrancesco, R-Union, to increase the membership of the State Board of Pharmacy from eight to nine members by adding another registered pharmacist.

<u>S-1969</u>, sponsored by Senator John Caufield, D-Essex, to increase the membership of the Fire Safety Commission from 19 to 20 members by adding a representative of the New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts.

<u>S-2244</u>, sponsored by Senator Thomas Cowan, D-Hudson, to change the date on which election officials may begin distributing absentee ballots from the 25th day prior to the primary or general election to the 40th day prior to those elections.

<u>S-2518</u>, sponsored by Senator John Russo, D-Ocean, to permit planning boards to grant for a period longer than two years the right to approve master plans for large commercial undertakings.
