An Act concerning the fire safety commission and amending P. L. 1983, c. 382.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 5 of P. L. 1983, c. 382 (C. 52:27D-25e) is amended to 2 read as follows:

5. a. To assist and advise the commissioner in the administra-3 tion of this act, there is created in the Department of Community 4 Affairs a fire safety commission consisting of [19] 20 members. $\mathbf{5}$ The commission shall consist of: two members of the Senate, ap-6 pointed by the President of the Senate, who shall not be both of 7 the same political party; two members of the General Assembly, 8 9 appointed by the Speaker of the General Assembly, who shall not 10 be both of the same political party; seven citizens of the State, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of 11 the General Assembly, no more than four of whom shall be of the 12same political party, including a representative of a volunteer fire 13organization, a representative of a construction labor organization, 14 a representative of the fire insurance industry, a representative of 15 the construction industry, a representative of the International 16 Association of Fire Chiefs, a municipal construction official, and 17 a representative of the New Jersey State Fire Prevention and Pro-18 tection Association; and [eight] nine citizens of the State ap-19 pointed by the Governor, no more than [four] five of whom shall 2021be of the same political party, and who shall include a representative of the New Jersey State Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Asso-22ciation, a representative of the New Jersey League of Municipali-23-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill EXPLANATIONis not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. ties, two representatives of the volunteer fire service, one of whom 24shall be a representative of the New Jersey State Volunteer Fire-2526men's Association, a representative of the New Jersey State Fire Chiefs' Association, a representative of the New Jersey Paid Fire 2728Chiefs' Association, a representative of the Fire Fighters' Association of New Jersey, a representative of the New Jersey *State* 2930 Association of Fire Districts, and a municipal fire protection subcode official. The members of the Senate and General Assembly ap-3132pointed to the commission shall serve for terms which shall be for 33 the legislative session for which they were elected. Of the seven 34members first appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and 35the Speaker of the General Assembly, three shall be appointed for 36terms of five years, three shall be appointed for terms of four 37years, and one shall be appointed for a term of three years. Of the eight members first appointed by the Governor, three shall be 38 appointed for terms of five years, three shall be appointed for a 3940term of four years, and two shall be appointed for terms of three years. The first representative of the New Jersey *State* Associa-41 tion of Fire Districts appointed by the Governor shall be for a term 42of three years. Thereafter, members of the fire safety commission, 43except as provided above for members of the Legislature, shall be 44 45appointed for terms of five years. Vacancies on the commission **4**6 shall be filled, in the same manner as the original appointment but for the unexpired term. Members may be removed by the appoint-47 $\mathbf{48}$ ing authority for cause.

b. Members of the fire safety commission shall serve without 49 compensation but shall be entitled to reimbursement for expenses 50incurred in performance of their duties, within the limits of any 51funds appropriated or otherwise made available for that purpose. 5253c. To advise and assist the fire safety commission in the per-54formance of its responsibilities under this act, there are created four advisory councils, one in each of the following subject areas: 55the "Uniform Fire Safety Act"; training and education which 5657shall be comprised of at least 60% of the representatives of the 58volunteer fire service; statistics and information; and master plan-59ning and research. Additional advisory council shall be created by 60 the fire safety commission as it deems appropriate. Each advisory 61council shall consist of one member of the fire safety commission, 62who shall be chairman, and as many citizens who are knowledgeable 63 and experienced in matters related to the particular subject as the 64 fire safety commission shall appoint. Members of the advisory councils shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of 6566 the fire safety commission.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Senate Bill No. 1969 increases the membership of the Fire Safety Commission in the Department of Community Affairs from 19 to 20 members. The additional member is to be a representative of the New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts. The New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts is a major fire organization which represents mainly volunteer firefighters.

The Assembly Law, Public Safety and Defense Committee amended the bill to clarify that the formal title of the association is the New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts.

Senate Bill No. 1969 adds a representative of the New Jersey Association of Fire Districts, a major fire organization in the State, to the Fire Safety Commission, increasing the membership of the commission from 19 to 20.

The Fire Safety Commission assists and advises the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs on matters of fire safety. BILL S-485, ET. AL. PAGE TWO WEDNESDAY, MARCH 27, 1985

Other bills signed by the Governor are:

<u>S-296</u>, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, R-Warren, which prohibits municipalities from assessing construction permit fees on the installation or alteration of solar energy heating or cooling systems.

<u>S-1143</u>, sponsored by Senator Wynona Lipman, D-Essex, to appropriate \$423,484 to provide one time State grants to loan agencies that are recipients of Federal Community Services block grants. The bill restricts the grants to those agencies whose funding cycle begins on October, November or December and requires them to move the starting date of their fiscal year to January 1.

<u>S-1365</u>, sponsored by Senator John Russo, D-Ocean, to provide that county welfare agencies shall handle interstate child support petitions and proceedings.

<u>S-1923</u>, sponsored by Senator Donald DiFrancesco, R-Union, to increase the membership of the State Board of Pharmacy from eight to nine members by adding another registered pharmacist.

<u>S-1969</u>, sponsored by Senator John Caufield, D-Essex, to increase the membership of the Fire Safety Commission from 19 to 20 members by adding a representative of the New Jersey State Association of Fire Districts.

<u>S-2244</u>, sponsored by Senator Thomas Cowan, D-Hudson, to change the date on which election officials may begin distributing absentee ballots from the 25th day prior to the primary or general election to the 40th day prior to those elections.

<u>S-2518</u>, sponsored by Senator John Russo, D-Ocean, to permit planning boards to grant for a period longer than two years the right to approve master plans for large commercial undertakings.
