An Acr concerning the making, negotiating and awarding of contracts by the Office of Legislative Services and amending P. L. 1979, c. 8.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 Section 11 of P. L. 1979, c. 8 (C. 52:11-64) is amended to read
- 2 as follows:

- 3 11. a. Contracts for consultants' services. The provisions of any
- 4 other law to the contrary notwithstanding, every contract or agree-
- 5 ment for consultants' services to be paid from funds appropriated
- 6 or otherwise made available to the Office of Legislative Services,
- 7 shall be made or awarded only by specific approval of the com-
- 8 mission.
- 9 b. Contracts for goods and services. The provisions of any other
