STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 6, 1984

Referred to Committee on State Government, Federal and Interstate Relations and Veterans Affairs

AN ACT concerning the disposition of the parimutuel pool at Garden State Racetrack and amending P. L. 1982, c. 201.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 5 of P. L. 1982, c. 201 (C. 5:5-98) is amended to read 2 as follows:

5. The permit holder shall distribute the sums deposited in parimutuel pools to winners thereof in accordance with section 44 of P. L. 1940, c. 17 (C. 5:5-64) and shall dispose of the deposits remaining undistributed as follows:

7 a. In the case of harness races:

8 (1) Hold and set aside in an account designated as a special 9 trust account 1% of such total contributions in all pools to be used 10 and distributed as hereinafter provided and as provided in sec-11 tion 5 of P. L. 1967, c. 40 (C. 5:5-88), for the following purposes 12 and no other:

13 (a) $42\frac{1}{2}\%$ thereof to increase purses and grant awards for starting horses as provided or as may be provided by rules of 14 the New Jersey Racing Commission with payment to be made 15in the same manner as payment of other purses and awards; 16 (b) 49% thereof for the establishment of a Sire Stakes 17 18 Program for standardbred horses with payment to be made 19 to the Department of Agriculture for administration as pro-20 vided;

21 (c) 5½% thereof for contributions and awards designed.

to improve and promote the standardbred breeding industry 22in New Jersey through payment of awards to owners and 23 $\mathbf{24}$ breeders of New Jersey bred horses which are registered with the Standardbred Breeders' and Owners' Association of New 25 Jersey and which earn portions of purses in open events on 26 New Jersey tracks, and to owners of stallions posted on the 27official stallions roster of the Standardbred Breeders' and 28 29Owners' Association of New Jersey which sire such registered 30 New Jersey bred money earners;

31 (d) 3% thereof for other New Jersey horse breeding and
32 promotion conducted by the New Jersey Department of Agri33 culture.

Payment of the sums held and set aside pursuant to subparagraphs (c) and (d) shall be made to the commission every seventh day of any and every race meeting in the amount then due as determined in the manner provided above, and shall be accompanied by a report under oath showing the total of all such contributions, together with such other information as the commission may require.

41 (2) Distribute as purse money and for programs designed to aid 42the horsemen and the Standardbred Breeders' and Owners' Asso-43 ciation of New Jersey 5% of such total contribution. Expenditures 44 for programs designed to aid the horsemen and the Standardbred Breeders' and Owners' Association of New Jersey shall not exceed 4546 3.5% of the sum available for distribution as purse money. The formula for distribution of the purse money as either overnight 47 purses or special stakes shall be determined by an agreement be-48 tween the Standardbred Breeders' and Owners' Association of 49 50New Jersey and the permitholder. Notwithstanding the foregoing, for pools where the patron is required to select two or more horses, 51 the permitholder shall distribute as purse money 5.5% of the total 5253contributions and for pools where the patron is required to select three or more horses, the permitholder shall distribute as purse 54money 7% of the total contributions. Notwithstanding the fore-5556 going, for pools where a patron is required to select three or more horses, the permitholder shall retain out of the 7% to be distributed 57as purse money, a sum deemed necessary by the racing commission, 58for use by the commission to finance a prerace blood testing pro-59 gram, and such other testing programs which the commission shall 60 61 deem proper and necessary and which shall be subject to the regulation and control of the commission. 62 63 b. In the case of running races:

64 (1) Hold and set aside in an account designated as a special

65 trust account [15%] 65% of 1% of such total contributions to be
66 used and distributed as hereinafter provided and as provided in
67 section 5 of P. L. 1967, c. 40 (C. 5:5-88), for the following purposes
68 and no other:

(a) [10%] 60% of 1% thereof for contributions and awards 69 70 designed to improve and promote the thoroughbred breeding 71industry in New Jersey through payment of wards to owners 72and breeders of registered New Jersey bred horses which 73 earn portions of purses in open events on New Jersey tracks, $\mathbf{74}$ and to owners of stallions posted on the official stallion rosters 75of the Thoroughbred Breeders' Association of New Jersey which sire such registered New Jersey bred money earners; 76

(b) 5% of 1% thereof for State horse breeding and development programs, research, fairs, horse shows, youth activities,
promotion and administration.

After the initial running race meeting conducted at the Garden 80 81 State Racetrack, the commission may reduce, for a period of time 82 to be determined by the commission, the amount specified above to be set aside for this special trust account upon a request by the 83 $\mathbf{84}$ permitholder and a determination by the commission that the payment of that amount would cause extreme financial hardship for 8586 the permitholder. In no event shall the commission reduce the amount to less than 15% of 1% of total contributions to all pari-87 mutuel pools at running race meetings at the racetrack. The per-88 mitholder may request an extension of the period of reduction or 89a further reduction or, subsequent to any restoration of the amount 90 specified above, another reduction. 91

92(2) Distribute as purse money and for programs designed to aid the horsemen and the New Jersey Horsemen's Benevolent and 93 Protective Association 4.24% of such total contributions. Expendi-94 tures for programs designed to aid the horsemen and the New 9596 Jersey Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association shall not exceed 2.9% of the sum available for distribution as purse 97 money. The formula for distribution of the purse money as either 98 overnight purses or special stakes shall be determined by an 99100 agreement between the New Jersey Horsemen's Benevolent and 101 Protective Association and the permitholder. Notwithstanding the 102 foregoing, for pools where the patron is required to select three or 103 more horses, the permitholder shall distribute as purse money 104 7.24% of the total contributions.

105 (3) For pools where a patron is required to select three or more 106 horses, 50% of 1% of the total contributions shall be held and set 107 aside in the special trust account established pursuant to section 108 46 b. (1) (e) (i) and 46 b. (2) (e) (i) of P. L. 1940, c. 17 (C. 5:5-66). 109 Payment of the sums held and set aside pursuant to paragraphs 110 (1) and (3) of this subsection shall be made to the commission 111 every seventh day of any and every race meeting in the amount 112 then due as determined in the manner provided above, and shall 113 be accompanied by a report under oath showing the total of all 114 such contributions, together with such other information as the 115 commission may require.

116 In addition to the amounts above, an amount equal to ½ of 1% 117 of all parimutuel pools shall be deposited annually in the General 118 Fund. All amounts remaining in parimutuel pools, including the 119 breaks, after the distribution and payments required by this 120 section shall constitute revenues of the permitholder. Except as 121 otherwise provided in this section, the permitholder shall not be 122 required to make any payments to the commission or others in 123 connection with contributions to parimutuel pools.

124 The provisions of this section shall apply each year for 10 125 years after the commencement of horse race meetings at the 126 Garden State Racetrack. At the end of the 10-year period, the 127 provisions of section 46 of P. L. 1940, c. 17 (C. 5:5-66) concerning 128 the distribution of undistributed deposits shall apply.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill increases from 15% of 1% to 65% of 1% of the parimutuel pool at running race meetings at Garden State Racetrack the amount to be set aside for the special trust account for programs to promote the thoroughbred breeding industry in New Jersey. This additional money is taken from the track's share of the parimutuel pool.

In addition, the bill provides that if the increase causes extreme financial hardship for the permitholder, the permitholder may request the New Jersey Racing Commission to reduce the amount, and the commission may do so for a period of time to be determined by the commission. In no event, however, shall the commission reduce the amount to less than 15% of 1% of the parimutuel pool at running race meetings at the track.

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<u>A-2454</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Anthony P. Vainieri, D-Hudson, which allows the closed-circuit testimony of victims or witnesses age 16 or younger in sexual abuse cases.

<u>AJR-20</u>, sponsored by Assembly Speaker Alan J. Karcher, D-Middlesex, which requires the Commissioners of Human Services and Health to study the possibility of establishing a residential care facility for patients afflicted with Huntingdon's Disease, a progressive neurological degenerative disease, which normally requires institutional care in its later phases.

<u>S-1737</u>, sponsored by State Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr., R-Warren, which allows farm winery licensees to manufacture wine using up to 49 percent out-of-state grown grapes during the winery's first five years of operation.

<u>S-1736</u>, also sponsored by Senator Dumont, which allows farm winery license holders to sell their product at retail for off-premises consumption at one additional location other than their manufacturing facility.

<u>S-1193</u>, sponsored by State Senator Richard J. Codey, D-Essex, which increases the amount of the parimutuel pool at Garden State Race Track which must be deposited in a special trust account for the New Jersey Thoroughbred Breeders Program from .15 percent to .65 percent. The bill brings the contribution into line with contributions from other race tracks in the State.

<u>S-526</u>, also sponsored by Senator Codey, which requires that all racing stewards and judges at privately owned race tracks be appointed by the New Jersey Racing Commission. Under current law some stewards and judges are appointed by the Racing Commission and others by the race tracks.

<u>S-141</u>, sponsored by State Senator Walter Rand, D-Camden, which provides that in counties not governed under the Optional County Charter Law (16 of the 21 counties) the governing body may designate an individual to approve payment of claims when the governing body is not meeting.

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
