AN ACT concerning bus driver licenses and amending R. S. 39:3-10.1.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 39:3–10.1 is amended to read as follows:

2 39:3-10.1. No person shall drive any motor vehicle or trackless trolley with a capacity of more than six passengers used for the 3 4 transportation of passengers for hire or for the transportation of passengers to or from summer day camps or summer residence 56 camps or any bus as defined by the director used for the [intra- $\mathbf{7}$ state] transportation of passengers, except vehicles used in ride-8 sharing arrangements, taxicabs, [hotel buses, and omnibuses used 9 for the transportation of passengers in interstate or foreign commerce,] or any bus used to transport children to and from 10 school pursuant to N. J. S. 18A:39-1 et seq. or when being used 11 by a private school to transport children to and from school, unless 12specially licensed so to do by the director or in the case of a non-13 resident, licensed pursuant to the laws of his resident state with 14 respect to the licensing of bus drivers. Such license shall not be 15granted by the director until the applicant therefor is at least 18 16 years of age and has passed a satisfactory examination in ascer-17 tainment of his driving ability and familiarity with the mechanism 18 of said vehicle and has presented evidence, satisfactory to the 19director of his previous experience (including proof that he has 20had at least three years of driving experience), good character 21and physical fitness. STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to remove the exception from the bus driver license statute that permits a person to operate a bus used for the interstate transportation of passengers without a bus driver's license.

A bus is considered to be an interstate bus if it travels into this State from another and makes only one stop in New Jersey to pick-up or discharge passengers.

The opening of the casinos in Atlantic City has led to an increase in the number of charter buses on the Garden State Parkway and the Atlantic City Expressway. Many of these buses are interstate buses because they only make on stop in New Jersey at Atlantic City. As a result of summonses issued to bus drivers, it has been determined that there are New Jersey drivers who operate interstate buses without New Jersey bus driver licenses. The Division of Motor Vehicles has drafted this bill, at the Attorney General's request, in order to close this loophole.

The purpose of Assembly Bill No. 3037 is to remove the exception from the bus driver license statute that permits a person to operate a bus used for the interstate transportation of passengers without a bus driver's license.

A bus is considered to be an interstate bus if it travels into this State from another and makes only one stop in New Jersey to pick-up or discharge passengers.

The bill requires drivers of all intrastate and interstate buses to be licensed in accordance with the bus driver's license provisions of their state of residence, whether the state of residence is New Jersey or some other state.
