STATEMENT

The transfer of the personnel of the Enforcement Bureau of the Division of Motor Vehicles to the Highway Patrol Bureau of the Division of State Police and the transfer of the personnel of the Enforcement Bureau of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control to the Division of State Police both by the Attorney General pursuant to the provisions of section 27 of P. L. 1948, c. 439 (C. 52:17B-27) and the transfer of the personnel of the State Marine Police, Department of Environmental Protection to the Division of State Police pursuant to section 1 of P. L. 1980, c. 96

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(C. 52:17B-9.5) and the reconstitution of the State Capitol Police Force pursuant to P. L. 1977, c. 135 (C. 52:17B-9.1 et seq.) requires that changes of certain job title names, but not functions related to those titles, be effectuated. To protect the funds already contributed to the Public Employees' Retirement System (law enforcement officers category) and the Police and Firemen's Retirement System by these transferred personnel, it is necessary to amend the two respective sections of Title 43 to reflect the new job titles. Without this bill, these individuals presently in the Public Employees' Retirement System (law enforcement officers category) and the Police and Firemen's Retirement System would lose that status in those systems and thereby lose their benefits.

L. 1948, c. 439 (C. 52:17B-27) and the transfer of the personnel of the State Marine Police, Department of Environmental Protection to the Division of State Police pursuant to section 1 of P. L. 1980, c. 96 (C. 52:17B-9.5) and the reconstitution of the State Capitol Police Force pursuant to P. L. 1977, c. 135 (C. 52:17B-9.1 et seq.) requires that changes of certain job title names, but not functions related to those titles, be effectuated. To protect the funds already contributed to the Public Employees' Retirement System (law enforcement officers category) and the Police and Firemen's Retirement System by these transferred personnel, it is necessary to amend the two respective sections of Title 43 to reflect the new job titles. Without this bill, these individuals presently in the Public Employees' Retirement System (law enforcement officers category) and the Police and Firemen's Retirement System would lose that status in those systems and thereby lose their benefits.

The bill was amended to conform it to the latest version of the law.
