AN ACT to amend the "Cosmetology and Hairstyling Act of 1984,"
approved December 4, 1984 (P. L. 1984, c. 205).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 17 of P. L. 1984, c. 205 (C. 40:5B-17) is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 17. An applicant seeking licensure as a cosmetologist-hairstylist
4 who does not at the time of that application hold a license to
5 practice barbering issued by the Board of Barber Examiners or
6 the board or a license to practice beauty culture issued by the Board
7 of Beauty Culture Control or the board shall:

8 a. Demonstrate successful completion of high school or its equiv-
9 alent; and

10 b. Demonstrate successful completion of a **[1,200 hour]** course
11 **[of instruction]** in cosmetology and hairstyling **[at]** *consisting of:*

12 (1) *1,200 hours of instruction at* a school of cosmetology and hair-
13 styling licensed in this State, or

14 (2) ***[1,000 hours of instruction at]*** **A program in** a public
15 school approved by the State Board of Education**[,]** to offer a
16 vocational program in cosmetology and hairstyling or

17 (3) *1,200 hours of instruction at* a school of cosmetology and hair-
18 styling, beauty culture or barbering licensed in another state or a
19 foreign country which, in the opinion of the board, offers curricula
20 which is substantially similar to that offered at licensed schools
21 within the State; and

STATEMENT

This bill reduces the number of course hours of instruction for licensure as a cosmetologist-hairstylist from 1,200 to 1,000 for students attending public school vocational programs. In addition to instruction in cosmetology and hairstyling, public school students receive related instruction in math and science through their other courses. This justifies their being required to complete fewer hours of vocational instruction than students enrolled in private schools of cosmetology and hairstyling where the 1,200 curriculum must include related instruction in math and science.

STATEMENT

These amendments eliminate the specific number of hours required for students in a public school vocational program for cosmetology and hairstyling. Rather, successful completion of the approved program would make them eligible for licensure.

Other bills signed by Kean include:

A-2102, sponsored by Assemblyman Alan Karcher, D-Middlesex, to revise the law concerning the resubmission of a Sunday closing law referendum in Hudson County. The bill changes the number of signatures required on a petition from 10 percent of the registered voters of the county to 2,500 and reduces from three years to two years the time period to resubmit the question.

S-2529, sponsored by Senator Daniel Dalton, D-Camden, to exempt from the State sales tax the sale of machinery, apparatus, equipment, building materials or structures used directly and primarily for cogeneration.

AJR-76, sponsored by Assemblyman Robert Hollenbeck, D-Bergen, to designate the new beneficial insect laboratory in Trenton as the Phillip Alampi Laboratory.

A-3375, sponsored by Assemblyman John Doyle, D-Ocean, to replace the 1,000-hour requirement for licensing as a cosmetologist-hairstylist if the person completes a vocational school program in cosmetology which has been approved by the State Board of Education.

A-1642, sponsored by Assemblyman Michael Adubato, D-Essex, to increase from \$200 to \$500 the amount of a bail bond certificate that may be issued by an automobile club or association.

S-2893, sponsored by Senator Francis McManimon, D-Mercer, to permit a corporation to act as a transfer agent of mutual funds for its own affiliates.
