# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JUNE 24, 1985

By Assemblyman VISOTCKY

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AN ACT concerning the Passaic Valley sewerage district and supplementing chapter 14 of Title 58 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. The boundary lines of the sewerage district known as the 2 Passaic Valley sewerage district, created by P. L. 1902, c. 48, as 3 supplemented and continued by R. S. 58:14-1, are altered, amended 4 and extended to include the entire areas within the corporate limits 5 of the borough of North Arlington and the township of Lyndhurst, 6 as hereinafter described:

7Beginning at the intersections of the centerlines of Rutherford Avenue and Ridge Road in the Township of Lyndhurst, also being 8 9 the boundary line between the Township of Lyndhurst and the 10 Borough of Rutherford; thence (1) southerly along the centerline of Ridge Road to a point which is intersected by the centerline of 11 12the Belleville Turnpike in the Borough of North Arlington, also being the boundary line between the Borough of North Arlington 13and the Town of Kearny; thence (2) in a southeasterly direction 14 along the centerline of Belleville Turnpike, and being the boundary 15line between the Borough of North Arlington and the Town of 16Kearny and also the boundary line between the County of Bergen 17 and the County of Hudson, to a point which is intersected by the 1819centerline of Saw Mill Creek, also being the southeasterly corner of the Borough of North Arlington; then (3) in a northeasterly 20direction along the centerline of the Saw Mill Creek, and being 2122the boundary line between the Borough of North Arlington and the Town of Kearny, to a point which is intersected by the centerline 23of the Hackensack River, also being a point in the boundary line  $\mathbf{24}$ 

25between the Township of Lyndhurst, the Town of Kearny and the 26Town of Secaucus; then (4) in a northerly direction along the 27centerline of the Hackensack River, and being the boundary line 28between the Township of Lyndhurst and the Town of Secaucus, and also being the boundary line between the County of Bergen 29 30 and the County of Hudson, to a point which is intersected by the 31 centerline of Berry's Creek, also being a point in the boundary 32line between the Township of Lyndhurst, the Town of Secaucus and Borough of Rutherford; then (5) in a northwesterly direc-33 tion along the centerline of Berry's Creek, and being the bound-3435ary line between the Township of Lyndhurst and the Borough of 36 Rutherford to a point which is intersected by the centerline of Rutherford Avenue if extended in a southeasterly direction a 37 distance of approximately 3,110 feet and being the northeasterly 38  $\mathbf{39}$ corner of the Township of Lyndhurst; thence (6) in a northwesterly direction along the northerly boundary line of the Township of 40 Lyndhurst and the southerly boundary line of the Borough of 41 42Rutherford which boundary line becomes Rutherford Avenue to a 43 point at the intersections of the centerline of Rutherford Avenue 44 and the centerline of Ridge Road and the point or place of begin-45ning.

2. The boundary lines of the sewerage district known as the Passaic Valley sewerage district, created by P. L. 1902, c. 48, as supplemented and continued by R. S. 58:14-1, are altered, amended and extended to include the entire area within the corporate limits of the Township of Little Falls, as hereinafter described:

Beginning at a point at center of Passaic River where same 6 7 intersects the borderline of the Borough of West Paterson, thence, 8 running southeasterly for a distance of approximately 6,350 feet 9 on a line parallel to the northerly side of Passaic Valley Water Commission right-of-way along Borough of West Paterson border-10 line, to a point on the northerly side of Lower Notch Road right-11 of-way and Borough of West Paterson line, thence, running south-1213westerly for a distance approximately 300 feet along Borough of 14 West Paterson borderline, to a point on southerly side of New 15Jersey State Highway Route 46 right-of-way and Borough of West Paterson borderline, thence, running southeasterly for a distance 16 17 approximately 1,000 feet along Borough of West Paterson border-18 line, to a point at center of Jackson Avenue and the Borough of 19 West Paterson borderline, thence, running southeasterly for a 20distance approximately 450 feet along center of Jackson Avenue, to a point at centers of Jackson avenue, Mountain Avenue, and 2122the New Jersey State Highway 46, thence, running easterly for a 23distance approximately 3,300 feet along Borough of West Paterson  $\mathbf{24}$ borderline, to a point at center of Notch Road and City of Clifton 25borderline, thence, running southwesterly for a distance approxi-26mately 5,200 feet along City of Clifton borderline, to a point of 27intersections of Town of Montclair line and City of Clifton border-28line, thence, running northwesterly for a distance approximately 291,400 feet along Essex County borderline to a point on the easterly 30side of easement right-of-way line, formerly owned by New York 31and Greenwood Lake Railroad, and thence, running southwesterly 32for a distance approximately 300 feet along the easterly side of 33easement right-of-way line, formerly owned by New York and 34Greenwood Lake Railroad, to a point of intersection of the easterly side of easement right-of-way, formerly owned by New York and 3536Greenwood Lake Railroad, and Township of Cedar Grove border-37line, thence, running northwesterly for a distance approximately 3818.000 feet along Essex County borderline, to a point of intersec-39tion between Township of Cedar Grove borderline and Borough 40 of North Caldwell borderline, thence, running westerly for a dis-41 tance approximately 1,700 feet along Essex County line, to the center of Main Street and Essex County borderline, thence, run-4243ning northwesterly for a distance approximately 800 feet along Essex County line, to center of Passaic River and Borough of West 44 Caldwell borderline, thence, running northeasterly on center of 4546 Passaic River for a distance approximately 15,600 feet along 47Township of Wayne borderline and Borough of Totowa borderline to the point of beginning. 48

5. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill supplements chapter 14 of Title 58 of the Revised Statutes to modify the boundaries of the Passaic Valley sewerage district in order to include the entire corporate limits of the borough of North Arlington and the township of Lyndhurst. At present, only portions of those municipalities fall within the boundaries of the district.

In addition, the bill expands the district's boundaries to include the township of Little Falls, a portion of the township of Wyckoff and the entire service area of the Jersey City Sewerage Authority.

Assembly Bill No. 3918 supplements chapter 14 of Title 58 of the Revised Statutes to modify the boundaries of the Passaic Valley Sewerage District in order to include the entire corporate limits of the Borough of North Arlington and the Township of Lyndhurst. At present, only portions of those municipalities fall within the boundaries of the district.

In addition, the bill extends the districts boundaries to include the township of Little Falls, a portion of the town of Wyckoff, and the entire service area of the Jersey City Sewerage Authority.
