# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

### PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1984 SESSION

By Assemblyman BENNETT

AN ACT concerning the duties of the Commissioner of the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, amending P. L. 1973, c. 185 and P. L. 1967, c. 106.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 13 of P. L. 1973, c. 185 (C. 13:19-13) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 13. There is hereby created the Coastal Area Review Board, in but not of the Department of Environmental Protection, which 4 shall consist of three voting members who shall be the Commis- $\mathbf{5}$ sioner of Environmental Protection or his designated representa-6 7 tive, the Commissioner of [Labor and Industry] Commerce and 8 Economic Development or his designated representative and the 9 Commissioner of Community Affairs or his designated representative. No vote on a permit request shall be taken unless all 10 voting members are present. 11

12The Coastal Area Review Board shall have the power to hear appeals from decisions of the commissioner pursuant to section 12 13 of P. L. 1973, c. 185 (13:19-12). The board may affirm or reverse 14 the decision of the commissioner with respect to applicability of 15any provision of this act to a proposed use; it may modify any 16 permit granted by the commissioner, grant a permit denied by him, 17 deny a permit granted by him, or confirm his grant of a permit. 18 The board shall review filed applications, including the environ-19 mental impact statement and all information presented at public 2021hearings and any other information the commissioner makes EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter printed in italics thus is new matter.

available to the board prior to the affirmation or reversal of adecision of the commissioner.

1 2. Section 3 of P. L. 1967, c. 106 (C. 26:2C-3.2) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 3. (a) There is hereby created in the State Department of 4 Health a Clean Air Council, which shall consist of 17 members, 3  $\mathbf{5}$ of whom shall be the Commissioner of [Labor and Industry] 6 Commerce and Economic Development or a member of the Department of [Labor and Industry] Commerce and Economic Develop-7 8 ment designated by him, the Commissioner of Community Affairs or a member of the Department of Community Affairs designated 9 10 by him, and the Secretary of Agriculture or a member of the Department of Agriculture designated by him, who shall serve 11 ex officio, six citizens of the State, representing the general public 1213 at least one of whom shall be a medical doctor licensed to practice in this State and eight members to be appointed from persons to be 14 nominated by the organizations hereinafter enumerated, by the 15 16 Governor.

(b) Within 30 days following the effective date hereof and 17 thereafter as required, at least one month prior to the expiration 18 19of the term of the member chosen from nominees of each organiza-20tion hereafter enumerated, each such organization shall submit to the Governor a list of three recommended nominees for member-2122ship on the council from which list the Governor shall appoint one. 23If any organization does not submit a list of recommended 24nominees at any time required by this act, the Governor may 25appoint a member of his choice.

The organizations which shall be entitled to submit recommended nominees are: New Jersey Health Officers Association, New Jersey State Chamber of Commerce, New Jersey Society of Professional Engineers, Inc., New Jersey Manufacturers Association, New Jersey Section of the American Industrial Hygiene Association, New Jersey State League of Municipalities, the New Jersey Freeholders' Association and the New Jersey State AFL-CIO.

33 (c) Of the 14 members first to be appointed, four shall be ap-34pointed for terms of one year, four for terms of two years, three 35for terms of three years and three for terms of four years. Thereafter, all appointments shall be made for terms of four years. All 3637 appointed members shall serve after the expiration of their terms  $\mathbf{38}$ until their respective successors are appointed and shall qualify, 39and any vacancy occurring in the appointed membership of the council by expiration of term or otherwise, shall be filled in the **4**0 41 same manner as the original appointment for the unexpired term

only, notwithstanding that the previous incumbent may have held
over and continued in office as aforesaid. The Governor may remove
any appointed member of the council for cause after a public
hearing.

(d) Members of the council shall serve without compensation
but shall be reimbursed for expenses actually incurred in attending meetings of the council and in the performance of their duties
as members thereof.

(e) The council shall elect annually a chairman and vice-chair-man from its own membership.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

This bill transfers membership in the Clean Air Council and Coastal Area Review Board from the Commissioner of the Department of Labor to the Commissioner of the Department of Commerce and Economic Development.

These duties were not transferred to the Department of Commerce and Economic Development under its enabling act, P. L. 1981, c. 122 (C. 52:27H-1 et al), but have been identified as duties which would more appropriately be exercised by the commissioner of that department.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

### DATED: MAY 7, 1984

This bill replaces the Commissioner of Labor with the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development on the Clean Air Council and the Coastal Area Review Board.

The duties discharged by members of these bodies are more appropriately exercised by the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development, but were not transferred when the new department was created.

The Assembly Agriculture and Environment Committee amended the bill to correct a technical deficiency. \*

Governor Thomas H. Kean has signed the following bills:

<u>A-307</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Robert D. Franks, R-Union, which amends the statute governing the State Health Benefits Program to provide coverage for service rendered by an extended care facility or by a home health agency regardless of whether the patient has been hospitalized.

<u>A-505</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Garabed Haytaian, R-Warren, which amends the Local Public Contracts Law to require notification to bidders of revisions or additions to advertisements or bid documents.

 $\underline{A-72\$}$ , sponsored by Assemblyman John O. Bennett, R-Monmouth, which transfers membership of the Clean Air Council and the Coastal Area Review Board from the Labor Commissioner to the Commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development.

<u>A-994</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Richard A. Zimmer, R-Hunterdon, which limits the liability of the owner, occupant or lessee of land who grants written permission to another to operate a motor vehicle or ride horseback on his or her land.

<u>A-1406</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Karl Weidel, R-Mercer, which establishes a comprehensive framework for the regulation of oil and natural gas production.

The bill sets requirements for permits at each stage of oil or natural gas production: exploration, extraction and plugging or abandoning a well and authorizes the Department of Environmental Protection to administer the permits and regulate the activity.
