STATE OF NEW JERSEY

PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1984 SESSION

By Senators WEISS and FORAN

An Act requiring superintendents of State correctional facilities and wardens or keepers of county penal institutions, or their designees, to notify local police departments of escapes from confinement of prisoners.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Any superintendent, or his designee, of any facility under the 2 control of the Department of Corrections or warden or keeper, or 3 his designee, of a county penal institution from which a prisoner 4 escapes from confinement shall notify the local police department 5 of the municipality in which the facility or institution is located 6 of the escape. Notification shall be made within one hour of the 7 time an escape is discovered.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill requires the superintendents of all State and county correctional facilities to notify local police departments of any escapes of prisoners from confinement within one hour of the time when the escapes are discovered.

Senate Bill No. 32 requires the superintendent of any State or county correctional facility to notify the local police department in the municipality in which the facility is located of any escapes of prisoners within one hour of the escape.

Governor Thomas H. Kean has signed the following bills:

<u>S-32</u>, sponsored by State Senator Laurence S. Weiss, D-Middlesex, which requires the superintendent of any State or county correctional institution to notify the local police department where the facility is located within one hour of the escape of any prisoner.

<u>S-382</u>, sponsored by State Senator S. Thomas Gagliano, R-Monmouth, which authorizes the presiding officer of a board of chosen freeholders to designate another freeholder to serve in his or her place on various county boards.

<u>S-1396</u>, sponsored by State Senator John H. Ewing, R-Somerset, which amends the law governing the State Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan to allow employees of any agency, authority, commission or instrumentality of State government to participate in the plan.

<u>S-2710</u>, sponsored by State Senator John P. Caufield, D-Essex, which would allow a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (PFRS) with at least 20 years of service who goes to work for a public agency or private nonprofit organization to purchase credit for time worked with the agency or organization for the PFRS.

The bill was conditionally vetoed by the Governor to allow the purchase of three years credit, rather than the two years contained in the original bill.

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Bills Signed - S-32, S-382, S-1396, S-2710, S-3074, S-3088, S-3421, SJR-76 Page 2 January 14, 1986

S-3074, sponsored by State Senator Matthew Feldman, D-Bergen, which extends the life of the New Jersey Commission on Hunger to June 30, 1986. The Commission scheduled expire was to on January 15, 1986.

<u>S-3088</u>, sponsored by State Senator John A. Lynch, D-Middlesex, which permits sewerage authorities to enter into joint contracts for the disposal of sewage sludge. The bill permits the six authorities which currently dump sludge at the site located 12 miles off the New Jersey coast to pool their resources to meet the Environmental Protection Agency mandate that all sludge be dumped at a site 106 miles off the coast after December, 1987.

<u>S-3421</u>, sponsored by State Senator John F. Russo, D-Ocean, which provides for the appointment of two additional judges in Ocean County for a new total of 12.

<u>SJR-76</u>, also sponsored by Senator Caufield, which extends the reporting date of the Property Tax Assessment Study Commission from March 19, 1986 to October 1, 1986. The extension will allow the Study Commission to consider information contained in a December, 1985, study of property tax administration released by the State Division of Taxation.

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
