AN ACT concerning county disaster coordinators, amending and supplementing P. L. 1953, c. 438.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 12 of P. L. 1953, c. 438 (C. App. A:9-42.1) is amended
2 to read as follows:

3 12. In every county of this State the [board of chosen free-
4 holders] *governing body* shall appoint a county disaster control
5 [co-ordinator] *coordinator* and a deputy county disaster control
6 [co-ordinator] *coordinator*, which appointments shall be *for terms*
7 *of office to be established by *ordinance or resolution, as appro-*
8 *priate, of* the governing body. Each term shall be for not less*
9 *than three nor more than five years. The appointments shall*
10 *be subject to the approval of the State Civilian Defense Director*
11 *and thereafter shall be subject to his orders. The State Civilian*
12 *Defense Director shall exercise supervision and control of all*
13 *such appointees, who may be removed by said State Civilian*
14 *Defense Director for cause.*

1 2. (New section) *[An individual serving as a county disaster
2 coordinator or deputy county disaster coordinator on the effective
3 date of this amendatory and supplementary act shall be considered
4 as serving the first day of the term established pursuant to section 1
5 herein on that date.]* **Within 90 days of the effective date of this*
6 *amendatory and supplementary act, the governing body of each*

AN ACT concerning county disaster coordinators, amending and supplementing P. L. 1953, c. 438.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 12 of P. L. 1953, c. 438 (C. App. A :9-42.1) is amended
2 to read as follows:

3 12. In every county of this State the [board of chosen free-
4 holders] *governing body* shall appoint a county disaster control
5 [co-ordinator] *coordinator* and a deputy county disaster control
6 [co-ordinator] *coordinator*, which appointments shall be *for terms*
7 *of office to be established by the governing body. Each term shall*
8 *be for not less than three nor more than five years. The appoint-*
9 *ments shall be* subject to the approval of the State Civilian Defense
10 Director and thereafter shall be subject to his orders. The State
11 Civilian Defense Director shall exercise supervision and control
12 of all such appointees, who may be removed by said State Civilian
13 Defense Director for cause.

1 2. (New section) An individual serving as a county disaster
2 coordinator or deputy county disaster coordinator on the effective
3 date of this amendatory and supplementary act shall be considered
4 as serving the first day of the term established pursuant to section 1
5 herein on that date.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill provides that the term of office of a county disaster coordinator and deputy county disaster coordinator shall be not less than three nor more than five years.

Assembly Bill No. 2506 Aca would clarify the terms served by a county disaster control coordinator and a deputy county disaster control coordinator. Such terms would be established by the governing body of the county for not less than three nor more than five years.

The bill, as amended by the committee, would require that the governing body of such county establish the term of a coordinator or deputy coordinator or determine not to alter an existing term that meets the requirements of the act within 90 days of the effective date of the act. In addition, the bill provides that any coordinator or deputy coordinator appointed prior to the effective date of the act would serve for the length of the term to which he was appointed. Thereafter, any term altered pursuant to the provisions of the act shall take effect.

The committee reported the bill favorably.

Assembly Bill No. 2506 OCR amends section 12 of P. L. 1953, c. 438 (C. App. A :9-42.1) to direct the governing body of each county to establish a formal term of office for the county disaster control coordinator and the deputy county disaster control coordinator. Under the provisions of the bill, the governing body is to establish, by ordinance or resolution as appropriate, a term of office of not less than three years nor more than five years.

The bill further specifies that the governing body must either act to establish a term of office for the coordinator and deputy coordinator or, if they already have a formal term of office which conforms with the provisions of the bill, reaffirm that existing term within 90 days of the effective date of the bill.

Finally, the bill clarifies that any coordinator or deputy coordinator appointed prior to the effective date of the bill is to serve for the length of the term to which he was appointed.

This amendment would provide that every county disaster control coordinator and deputy county disaster control coordinator would serve for terms of three years. Any person serving in those positions when the act took effect would serve for the length of the term to which the person was appointed and then, if re-appointed, would serve a three year term.

A-268, sponsored by Assemblyman Wayne Bryant, D-Camden, to provide that public assistance checks be mailed to eligible recipients four times per month on a staggered basis, starting on April 1, 1987.

A-1701, sponsored by Assemblyman Robert Littell, R-Sussex, to authorize the Department of Transportation to extend Route 15 from its intersection with Route 181 in Sparta to a point in Branchville Borough.

A-1983, sponsored by Assemblyman Joseph Patero, D-Somerset, to restore as a defense against prosecution for sale of alcoholic beverages to a minor that a written representation as to age was made by the buyer to the seller.

A-2506, sponsored by Assemblywoman Jacqueline Walker, D-Middlesex, to provide that county disaster control coordinators and deputy disaster control coordinators be appointed to serve terms of three years.

A-3199, sponsored by Assemblyman John Doyle, D-Ocean, to extend the time for filing a post year statement of income by senior citizens or the totally disabled for a property tax deduction if the filing deadline was missed due to illness.

S-3737, sponsored by Assemblyman Joseph Doria, D-Hudson, to grant immunity from liability for civil damages to members of ethics, grievances, judicial, quality assurance or professional hospital review committee, long-term health care facility, or professional association.

A-4058, sponsored by Assemblyman James Zangari, D-Essex, to increase the number of judges in Essex County from 26 to 28.
