AN ACT to amend "An act concerning the application, removal, and encapsulation of asbestos, and making an appropriation," approved October 31, 1984 (P. L. 1984, c. 173).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 8 of P. L. 1984, c. 173 (C. 34:5A-39) is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 8. Not later than six months after the effective date of this act,  
4 the Commissioners of Labor and Health jointly shall, in consulta-  
5 tion with the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, adopt all  
6 standards and regulations which they deem necessary for the  
7 proper administration and enforcement of this act. These stan-  
8 dards and regulations shall include, but shall not be limited to,  
9 protective equipment specifications; application, enclosure, re-  
10 moval, and encapsulation procedures; administrative penalties;  
11 waste disposal; self-monitoring; cleanup; health checkup; license  
12 and permit issuance and revocation; fee charges; experience neces-  
13 sary for license or permit qualification; general subject matter of  
14 qualifying examinations; and continuing education. License and  
15 permit qualification standards shall include provision for experi-  
16 enced asbestos workers to apply for and receive a permit without  
17 examination [for a period not in excess of one year from the effec-  
18 tive date of this act].

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

**EXPLANATION**—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

## STATEMENT

This bill amends P. L. 1984, c. 173 to extend the time period during which an experienced asbestos worker may receive a permit without examination from the Department of Labor. Current law allows such a worker one year to receive a permit without examination, while this bill will remove that one year limit.
