An Acr concerning the regulation of the practice of acupuncture and amending P. L. 1983, c. 7.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 3 of P. L. 1983, c. 7 (C. 45:2C-3) is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 3. There is created in the Division of Consumer Affairs of the 4 Department of Law and Public Safety and under the State Board 5 of Medical Examiners and Acupuncture Examining Board consisting of nine members, four of whom shall be acupuncturists. 6 7 certified in this State and not licensed as physicians and surgeons, 8 two members shall be physicians and surgeons licensed in this State 9 with at least two years experience in acupuncture; and pursuant to the provisions of section 2 of P. L. 1971, c. 60 (C. 45:1-2.2) two 10 members shall be public members who do not hold a license or 11 certificate as a physician and surgeon or acupuncturist and one 12 member shall be from a department in the Executive Branch of 13 the State government. The four acupuncturists initially appointed 14 to the board need not be certified in this State but shall be certified 15 in another state and shall be deemed to be and shall become certi-16 fied acupuncturists in this State [as soon as possible after] im-17 mediately upon their appointments as members of the board. The 18 members of the board shall be residents of the State appointed by 19 20 the Governor for terms of three years and until the appointment and qualification of their successors. for two years; and three shall hold office for three years. Vacan-cies shall be filled for the unexpired terms only.

25The board shall organize as soon as possible after the appoint-26ment of its members and shall annually elect a chairman and a 27secretary from among its members. The board shall carry out the 28responsibilities assigned to it under this act and such other matters 29as the State Board of Medical Examiners may require. The board shall promulgate such rules and regulations as it deems necessary 30to effectuate the purposes of this act. All regulations adopted, 3132amended or repealed by the board shall be subject to the review and approval of the State Board of Medical Examiners. 33

1 2. Section 7 of P. L. 1983, c. 7 (C. 45:2C-7) is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 7. No person who is not certified under this act shall practice acupuncture, hold himself out as practicing acupuncture, or use 4 a title or description, including the following: C. A., Certified Acu- $\mathbf{5}$ 6 -puncturist; Acupuncturist; M. D., C. A.; M. D., Certified Acupuncturist; or any other letters or words denoting that the person so 7 practices acupuncture. A person who is participating in an ap---8 proved course of study, school or tutorial program in acupuncture •9 may practice acupuncture under conditions established by the 10board. 11

12 The State Board of Medical Examiners may suspend or revoke 13 a license to practice medicine and surgery for a registration to 14 practice physical therapy upon proof to its satisfaction that the 15 holder thereof practiced acupuncture contrary to the provisions of 16 this act or employed a person who practiced acupuncture without 17 certification.

1 3. Section 9 of P. L. 1983, c. 7 (C. 45:2C-9) is amended to read 2 as follows:

9. Each person desiring to obtain a certification to practice acupuncture shall make application therefor to the board upon such
form and in such manner as the board shall prescribe and shall
furnish satisfactory evidence to the board that he:
a. Is at least 21 years of age;

8 b. Is of good moral character; and

9 c. (1) Has a baccalaureate degree and has successfully com-10 pleted a board approved **[**two-years**]** two-year course of study or 11 a board approved two-year program of a school of acupuncture 12 or (2) has successfully completed a board approved tutorial pro-13 gram in acupuncture or at least three years experience practicing 14 acupuncture within three years after the enactment of this act 15 which is recognized by the board or (3) is the holder of a license to practice medicine and surgery [or registration to practice physical therapy in this State]. The application shall be accompanied
by the fee prescribed by the board.
The board shall evaluate each applicant applying for a certificate
to practice acupuncture and make the final determination regarding each applicant's admission to the examination and the issuance
or denial of a certificate.
4. Section 13 of P. L. 1983, c. 7 (C. 45:2C-13) is amended to

3 13. a. The board shall establish standards for the approval or
4 recognition of courses of study, schools, tutorial programs and
5 practical experience in acupuncture, completion of which will sat6 isfy the requirements of subsection [d.] c. of section 9 of this act.
7 b. The board shall approve or recognize training or practical
8 experience acquired by an applicant prior to the effective date of

9 this act where the training or practical experience meets the10 standards set by the board

1 5. Section 14 of P. L. 1983, c. 7 (C. 45:2C-14) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 14. A tutorial program in acupuncture shall be provided under
4 the supervision of an acupuncturist approved by the board. To
5 obtain approval an acupuncturist shall:

a. Make application therefor to the board upon such form and
7 in such manner as the board shall prescribe, accompanied by pay8 ment of the prescribed fee;

9 b. Be certified to practice acupuncture in this State;

c. Have at least seven years experience practicing acupuncture.
An approved acupuncturist shall supervise no more than two
students at one time and shall inform the board in writing of the
names of the students the acupuncturist is supervising and any
other information the board may require.

Approvals shall be granted for one year and shall be renewed 15annually. An approved acupuncturist shall pay a renewal fee pre-16 scribed by the board to the board on or before July 1 of each year. 17 If the renewal fee is not paid by that date the approval shall auto-18 matically expire. Approval which has thus expired may, within 19 one year of its expiration, be renewed on payment to the board 20of the past due renewal fee and a delinquency fee. After the one 21year period approval may be renewed only by complying with the 22provisions of this section [of this act]. 23

24 [The provisions of this section shall expire three years after the 25 enactment of this act.]

6. This act shall take effect immediately and shall be retroactive
 to January 18, 1983.

STATEMENT

This bill clarifies an ambiguity in the law establishing the Acupuncturist Examining Board. This bill provides that initial members of the board, who must be certified acupuncturists in another state, shall be certified acupuncturists in this State by virtue of their appointment to the board. This certification mechanism is similar to the licensing mechanisms for the initial appointees to other professional boards in this State, such as the State Board of Psychological Examiners and fulfills the original intent of the Legislature when it established the board. In addition, the bill makes several technical corrections to the law. This bill is similar to a bill recently passed by the Legislature. Unlike that bill, however, this bill retains the jurisdiction of the State Board of Medical Examiners over the Acupuncture Examining Board.

<u>A-888</u>, sponsored by Assemblywoman Marie S. Mihler, R-Monmouth, which increases the fee for a teaching certificate from 5 to 30, the first increase in this fee in more than 40 years. The bill provides for a 20refund for individuals whose credentials are insufficient to entitle them to a certificate.

<u>S-1756</u>, sponsored by State Senator Francis J. McManimon, D-Mercer, which provides that the four initial acupuncturist members of the Acupuncturists Examining Board shall receive certification in New Jersey as acupuncturists by virtue of their appointment. Those members must, by law, already be certified as acupuncturists in another state. The bill retains the jurisdiction of the State Board of Medical Examiners[•] over the Acupuncture Examining Board.
