## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED MAY 7, 1984

By Assemblymen CUPROWSKI, VAINIERI, RANIERI, ROONEY, CHARLES, DORIA and LAROCCA

An Act to designate July 20th of each year as "New Jersey P.O.W.-M.I.A. Recognition Day" and providing for the issuance by the Governor of an annual proclamation thereof.

- 1 Whereas, The citizens of this State have proudly answered the
- 2 call of their country in war; and
- 3 Whereas, Thousands of Americans from across this nation who
- 4 so served were captured by the enemy or are missing in action;
- 5 and
- 6 Whereas, Often, those prisoners of war were subjected to brutal
- 7 and inhuman treatment by their enemy captors in violation of
- 8 international codes and customs for the treatment of prisoners
- 9 of war, in some cases resulting in their deaths; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The fate of those Americans missing in action, including
- the sons and daughters of this State, is unknown, causing their
- 12 families inestimable suffering and hardship; and
- 13 Whereas, Senate Resolution 171 and House Resolution 344, cur-
- 14 rently pending before Congress, propose to designate July 20th,

Governor Thomas H. Kean today signed legislation designating July 20 of each year as "New Jersey POW-MIA Recognition Day."

The Governor signed the bill, A-1886, during a ceremony in his office attended by representatives of more than 20 different veterans' organizations from throughout New Jersey.

The legislation was sponsored by Assemblyman Paul Cuprowski, D-Hudson, and requires that the Governor issue an annual proclamation recognizing those individuals who were taken prisoner during wartime or who are listed as missing in action.

"Nothing, of course, can ever ease the heartbreak of the loss of a loved one or the painful uncertainty involving those who are missing in action, but we can, by this legislation, officially urge all New Jerseyans to pause and remember those who took up arms in the defense of our nation," Kean said.
