STATE OF NEW JERSEY

PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1984 SESSION

By Senator VAN WAGNER

An Act concerning education and amending P. L. 1974, c. 79.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 3 of P. L. 1974, c. 79 (C. 18A:58-37.3) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 3. a. The board of education in each school district in the State 4 *in which a nonpublic school is located* shall have the power and 5 duty to purchase and to loan textbooks upon individual request, to 6 all students **[**residing**]** *attending school* in such district, who are 7 enrolled in grades kindergarten through 12 of a public or nonpublic 8 school.

9 b. No board of education shall be required to expend funds for

10 the purchase and loan of textbooks in excess of the amounts pro-

11 vided in State aid pursuant to this act.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

P. L. 1974, c. 79 now calls for textbooks for nonpublic school children to be provided each year by the district in which the child resides. Because most nonpublic schools serve children from many districts, there is much paperwork between each district and the nonpublic school. Because books are then ordered by each district, the books arrive at different times and often after classes in the nonpublic schools have started. These problems would be minimized if not eliminated by making the district in which the nonpublic school is located responsible for purchasing and loaning textbooks for the nonpublic school children.
