STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED JUNE 18, 1984

By Assemblymen DOYLE and ZANGARI

AN ACT providing for certification in the classified service of former employees of dissolved authorities who are employed by local units, and supplementing Title 11 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. For those local units which have adopted the provisions of
2 Title 11 of the Revised Statutes, and have authorized by ordinance
3 or resolution, as the case may be, the dissolution of an authority,
4 all positions and employments formerly in the authority and absorb-
5 ed by the local unit shall become subject to Title 11 of the Revised
6 Statutes and shall be allocated to appropriate titles by the Civil
7 Service Commission. Upon receipt from the Civil Service Com-
8 mission of a list of the positions and employments so allocated to
9 the classified service and their appropriate titles, the governing
10 body shall certify to the Civil Service Commission within 30 days
11 of receipt of the list, the names of all those employees formerly
12 employed by the authority in these allocated positions and employ-
13 ments who were employed on the effective date of this act. The
14 employees so certified shall be recorded, under these titles after
15 passing a qualifying examination, as having been permanently
16 appointed in the classified service of Civil Service as of the date
17 of their original appointment and shall thereafter be under and
18 shall be subject to the provisions of Title 11 of the Revised Statutes.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill would provide Civil Service coverage to employees of autonomous authorities which have been dissolved by either a county or municipality which is subject to Title 11 of the Revised Statutes. Employees of such former authorities as of the effective date of the Act, who are in titles allocated by the Civil Service Commission to the classified service, would be recorded, after passing a qualifying examination, in the classified service as of the date of their original appointment.

STATEMENT

This bill would provide Civil Service coverage to employees of autonomous authorities which have been dissolved by either a county or municipality which is subject to Title 11 of the Revised Statutes. 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Bills

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*Members of the State Advisory Board of Public Movers and Warehousemen be compensated at the rate of \$50 per diem.

"This legislation will give the Division of Consumer Affairs the authority to crackdown on illegal movers who take advantage of unsuspecting persons who contract to move household belongings and furnishings," Kean said. "There have been incidents of unlicensed and illegal movers making off with personal possessions, overcharging persons, and damaging goods in their care. These tough, new provisions will afford protection to people against these kinds of abuses and illegal practices."

Kean also signed S-1115, sponsored by Senator John Lynch, D-Middlesex, which permits redevelopment agencies to sell notes for a period not to exceed five years at a private sale without advertisement.

The Governor also signed A-2150, sponsored by Assemblyman John Doyle, D-Ocean, which provides Civil Service coverage to employees of autonomous authorities which have been dissolved by a county or municipality.

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
