STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED NOVEMBER 19, 1984

By Senators VAN WAGNER and GAGLIANO

(Without Reference)

An Act to amend the "New Jersey Health Care Facilities Financing Authority Law," approved May 25, 1972(P. L. 1972, c. 29).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 34 of P. L. 1972, c. 29(C. 26:2I-34) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 34. a. Participation in existing projects. Whenever any public or 4 private hospital has constructed or acquired any work or improve- $\mathbf{5}$ ment which would otherwise qualify as a project under the preceding portions of this act except for the fact that such construc-6 7 tion or acquisition was undertaken and financed without assistance from the authority, the authority may purchase such work or im-8 9 provement, and lease the same to such hospital, or may lend funds 10to such hospital for the purpose of enabling the latter to retire obligations incurred for such construction or acquisition, provided 11 12that the amount of any such purchase price or loan shall not exceed 13 the project cost as herein defined, irrespective of such work or improvement. All powers, rights, obligations and duties granted to 14 or imposed upon the authority, hospitals, State departments and 15agencies or others by this act in respect to projects shall apply to 16 the same extent with respect to transactions authorized by this 17 18 section, provided that any action otherwise required to be taken at a particular time in the progression of a project may, where the 19 circumstances so required in connection with a transaction under 2021this section be taken nunc pro tunc.

Matter printed in italics thus is new matter.

b. Acquisition of hospital facilities from counties or municipali-2223ties. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, $\mathbf{24}$ the authority may authorize the acquisition, and any county or 25municipality by resolution or ordinance may authorize a private 26sale and conveyance or leasing to the authority, of any interest of 27the county or municipality in any lands and existing hospital facili- $\mathbf{28}$ ties which are then being operated by a private or public hospital 29upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon by the authority and the county and municipality. The authority may use its 30 funds for the acquisition by providing for the retirement of obliga-3132 tions incurred for the acquisition of the land, and for the acquisition and construction of the existing hospital facilities, provided 33 34 that the amount of the purchase price shall not exceed the project 35costs. Upon acquisition of the lands and existing hospital facilities, the authority may convey or lease the lands and existing hospital 36 facilities to a participating hospital under such terms and condi-37 tions as the authority and participating hospital may agree. 38

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of the bill is to permit the New Jersey Health Care Facilities Financing Authority, to acquire hospital facilities from counties and municipalities in certain situations, to permit counties and municipalities to convey by private sale or lease to the authority any interest in a hospital facility notwithstanding any other law, including the "Local Lands and Buildings Law," P. L. 1971, c. 199 (C. 40:12–1 et seq.); and to permit the authority to convey or lease the hospital facility to a participating hospital under such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon. Kean also signed <u>S-2394</u>, sponsored by Senator Richard VanWagner, D-Monmouth, which permits the New Jersey Health Care Facilities Financing Authority to provide financial aid to health care institutions which have previously financed their capital programs through bond issues sponsored by counties or municipalities.
