An Act concerning certain appropriations by counties and supplementing P. L. 1976, c. 68 (C. 40A:4-45.1 et seq.).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

2 of New Jersey:

1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 4 of P. L. 1976,
2 c. 68 (C. 40A:4-45.4) to the contrary, a county which incurs in 3 creased costs due to an increase in the number of beds provided
4 and occupied in county nursing homes may expend funds as may
5 be necessary to *[defer]* *defray* those costs as an exception to
6 the spending limitations imposed by P. L. 1976, c. 68 (C. 40A:4-45.1
7 et seq.) in the year in which such costs are first realized.

b. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 2 of P. L. 1976, c. 68 8 (C. 40A:4-45.2) to the contrary, in the year following the year in 9 which an exception is taken pursuant to subsection a. of this sec-10 tion, the amount excepted in that year minus any * [increase in 11 the]* amount received in that year from federal, State or other 12sources as reimbursement for expenses incurred for the care and 13treatment of residents of county nursing homes, shall be added by 14 the county to its final appropriations for the current year for the 15purpose of calculating its permissible increase in the county tax 16 levy for the current budget year. 17

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to the 2 1984 local budget year and thereafter.

Assembly Bill No. 815 ACA permits a county which incurs increased costs due to an increase in the number of beds provided and occupied in county nursing homes to expend the funds as may be necessary to defray those increased costs as an exception to the cap limitation in the year in which those costs are first realized. Thereafter, any amount so excepted, minus any amount received from federal, State or other sources as reimbursement for the care and treatment of the additional residents in the county nursing homes, shall be added by the county to its final appropriations for the current year for the purpose of calculating its permissible increase in the county tax levy for the current budget year.

The committee amendments are technical in nature.

Assembly Bill No. 815 OCR would supplement P. L. 1976, c. 68 (C. 40A:4-45.1 et seq.) to permit a county which incurs increased costs due to an increase in the number of beds provided and occupied in county nursing homes to expend, in the year in which those costs are first realized, the funds necessary to defray those costs as an exception to the limitations on final appropriations imposed by that law. Thereafter, any amount so excepted, minus any amount received from federal, State or other sources as reimbursement for expenses incurred for the care and treatment of the additional residents in the county nursing homes, shall be added by the county to its final appropriations for the current year for the purpose of calculating its permissible increase in the county tax levy for the current budget year.

BILLS SIGNED PAGE TWO DECEMBER 31, 1984

<u>A-2370</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Jimmy Zangari, D-Essex, which permits police officers to wear, without local department authorization, medals awarded by a service organization.

The bill was conditionally vetoed by the Governor to apply only to medals awarded by police-oriented service organizations.

<u>A-815</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Thomas W. Long, D-Union, which provides counties with a first year budget cap exemption for increased costs associated with the addition of new beds to a county nursing home. The bill permits the county to expend the funds necessary for new beds for the year in which they first occur.

<u>A-2491</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Garabed Haytaian, R-Warren, which extends until December 31, 1986, an exemption to the cap law for money expended as matching funds for any State or Federal aid program, and any amounts they receive from State, Federal or other sources as reimbursement of a local expense.

<u>A-2893</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Joseph D. Patero, D-Somerset, which provides a one-year cap adjustment for municipalities that begin providing garbage collection service for residents in response to a State-ordered closure of their municipal landfill.

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
