# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED NOVEMBER 29, 1984

By Senator ORECHIO

(Without Reference)

AN ACT concerning the appointment of certain municipal disaster control directors and amending P. L. 1953, c. 438.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 8 of P. L. 1953, c. 438 (C. App: 9-40.1) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 8. In every municipality of this State the mayor, or in the case of a municipality which has adopted the commission form of 4 government pursuant to the provisions of the "commission form  $\mathbf{5}$ of government law" (R. S. 40:70-1 et seq.), the commissioner 6 serving as director of the department to which the responsibility 7 for local disaster control has been assigned, shall appoint a 8 municipal disaster control director from among the residents of the 9 municipality The municipal disaster control director, subject to 10 fulfilling the requirements of this section, shall serve for a term of 11 three years. As a condition of his appointment and his right to con-1213 tinue for the full term of his appointment, each municipal disaster control director shall have successfully completed at the time of 14 his appointment or within one year immediately following his 15appointment or within one year immediately following his appoint-16 ment or the effective date of this act, whichever is later, the current, 17 approved, Civil Defense Director-Coordinator Course. The failure 18of any municipal disaster control director to fulfill such require-19 ments within the period prescribed shall disqualify the director 20 from continuing in the office of director and thereupon a vacancy 21in said office shall be deemed to have been created. 22

Matter printed in italics thus is new matter.

1 2. Section 18 of P. L. 1953, c. 438 (C. App: 9-40.2) is amended 2 to read as follows:

3 18. The Governor may remove any municipal disaster control director at any time for cause. In such event the mayor of the 4 municipality, or in the case of a municipality which has adopted 5 the commission form of government pursuant to the provisions 6 of the "commission form of government law" (R. S. 40:70-1 7 et seq.), the commissioner serving as director of the department to 8 9 which the responsibility for local disaster control has been assigned, 10shall appoint a new municipal disaster control director with the 11 approval of the Governor. If the mayor or commissioner, as 12 appropriate, shall not appoint a municipal disaster control director within ten days after such office shall become vacant, the Governor 13 may appoint a temporary municipal disaster control director who 14 shall serve and perform all of the duties of that office until such 15 time as a new municipal disaster control director shall be appointed 16 by the mayor or commissioner, as appropriate, with the approval 17 18 of the Governor.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that in the case of a municipality operating under the commissioner form of government pursuant to the provisions of the "commissioner form of government law" (R. S. 40:70-1 et seq.), the commissioner serving as the director of the department to which the responsibility for local disaster control has been assigned shall appoint the municipal disaster control director.

Governor Thomas H. Kean has signed the following bills:

<u>A-2701</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Martin A. Herman, D-Salem, which transfers the Bureau of Alcohol Countermeasures, currently in the Division of Motor Vehicles, to the Division of Alcoholism in the Department of Health.

The Bureau of Alcohol Countermeasures is responsible for screening, evaluation, education and referral for treatment of persons convicted of drunk driving. Since the Intoxicated Driver Resource Centers created last year are operated by the Division of Alcoholism, the transfer places the two similar functions under the same administrative agency.

<u>A-17</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Jimmy Zangari, E-Essex, which provides that insurers are prohibited from paying fire insurance claims until the insured submits official certification that demolition is not required, or that the costs of demolition have been paid.

<u>S-1528</u>, sponsored by State Senator Edward T. O'Connor, Jr., D-Hudson, which makes administrative amendments to the Uniform Limited Partnership Act of 1976.

<u>S-2479</u>, sponsored by Senate President Carmen A. Orechio, D-Essex, which provides for the appointment of a municipal disaster control director in municipalities governed under the commission form of government. The director would be appointed by the commissioner responsible for disaster control.

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
