1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*

1 1. Any ***[male]*** member of the retirement system, born in 1920,
2 having at least 33 years of service credit as an employee of the
3 same school district, which is coterminous with a municipality that
4 had a population of 7,000 to 8,000 people according to the 1970
5 census and said municipality is designated as the county seat of a
6 county of the third class that had a population of 75,000 to 100,000
7 according to the 1970 census and borders both the States of New
8 York and Pennsylvania, and who prior to said service served said
9 district in a temporary capacity for a period of not less than 3
10 months following which said member was inducted into the U. S.
11 Army and served therein from July 15, 1942, to December, 1945,
12 and then was recalled and served as an officer in the U. S. Army
13 from September, 1950, to June, 1952, receiving an honorable dis-
14 charge at the conclusion of his military service, shall be granted
15 credit for said military service during 1942 to 1945 to the same
16 extent that he would have been entitled to credit for said service
17 if his temporary employment with the school district had been on
18 a permanent basis.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

PROVISIONS:

This bill grants credit to a certain member of the Teacher's Pension and Annuity Fund for having served in the armed forces after having been employed by a school district and having been classified as a temporary teaching staff member.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, credit can only be given for military service if a teaching staff member was employed as a permanent staff member in a school district. This bill affects one teacher who was incorrectly classified as a substitute teacher prior to entering the armed services during World War II.

Governor Thomas H. Kean today signed the following bills:

SJR-19, sponsored by Senator James W. Bornheimer (D-Middlesex), designates Square Dancing as the official American Folk Dance of New Jersey. The square dance was made the National Folk Dance of the United States by the Federal government earlier this year.

S-1598, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont (R-Warren), allows boards of education to make two-year contracts to buy materials which are needed on a recurring basis. The contracts can be renewed every year for up to three years after the initial contract has expired, but the cost of the new contract may not be increased by more than 20 percent over the three-year period. This bill is one of several meant to carry out the recommendations of a report issued in July 1982 by the Commission on Business Efficiency of the Public Schools.

S-889, sponsored by Senator Wynona Lipman (D-Essex), amends statutes which deal with inheritance by children born out of wedlock. The bill defines a person as the child of his or her natural parents whether or not they were married, and is intended to clarify the laws governing inheritance by illegitimate children.

S-1952, sponsored by Senator Garrett W. Hagedorn (R-Bergen), establishes a special exemption from the municipal cap law for Ridgewood, because of legal expenses which the municipality will incur during a lawsuit against the Hackensack Water Company. The exemption only lasts for the calendar year 1983, and will allow the town to fit the legal fees into its budget.

S-1448, sponsored by Senator John F. Russo (D-Ocean), allows municipalities to collect garbage on private streets or to pay for such service; the bill is designed to permit towns to collect garbage from places like senior citizen communities and planned-unit developments.

S-931, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont (R-Warren), allows for military service to be given to a teacher who had been wrongly listed as a substitute teacher before his military service; military service credits apply only to permanent teachers.
