$\operatorname{Provisions}$:

This bill allows boards of education to award contracts for materials, equipment and supplies for which there is an existing State contract, without advertising or receiving bids if they solicit and receive at least three quotations, and the lowest responsible quotation is at least 10% less than the State contract price for identical goods in the same quantities.

BACKGROUND:

This bill is one of a series of bills implementing the July, 1982 report of the Financial Management Subcommittee of the Commission on Business Efficiency of the Public Schools.

This would enable larger districts to obtain a lower price or discount based on volume without having to go to the expense of advertising bids.

Committee Amendments:

Governor Thomas H. Kean today signed the following bill:

<u>S-1614</u>, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr. (R-Warren-Sussex), which allows Boards of Education to award contracts for materials, equipment and supplies for which there is an existing State contract, without advertising or receiving bids if they solicit and receive at least three quotations, and the lowest responsible quotation is at least ten percent less than the State contract price for identical goods in the same quantities. The bill permits larger school districts to obtain a lower price or discount based on volume without incurring the expense of advertising bids.
