An Act concerning leaves of absences of certain public employees to attend State or national conventions and amending P. L. 1977, c. 347.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1977, c. 347 (C. 40A:14-177) is amended to 2 to read as follows:

1. The heads of the county offices of the several counties and 3 4 the head of every department, bureau and office in the government of the various municipalities, shall give a leave of absence with 5pay to every person in the service of the county or municipality 6 who is a duly authorized representative of the New Jersey State 7 8 Patrolmen's Benevolent Association, Inc., Fraternal Order of Police, American Federation of Police Officers, Inc., Brown Shield, 9 10 Inc., Botons, Vulcan Pioners, a member organization of the New Jersey Council of Charter Members of the National Black Police 11 Association, Inc., Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association, Inc., 12the Uniformed Firemen's Association, or the New Jersey State 13 Association of Chiefs of Police, to attend any State or National 14 15convention of such organization. A certificate of attendance to the State convention shall, upon 16

17 request, be submitted by the representative so attending.

18 Leave of absence shall be for a period inclusive of the duration

19 of the convention with a reasonable time allowed for time to travel

20 to and from the convention.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MARCH 14, 1983

Assembly Bill No. 1468 amends section 1 of P. L. 1977, c. 347 (C. 40A:14-177) to entitle any local police and firemen to a leave of absence with pay whenever he attends a State or national convention of the American Federation of Police Officers, Inc., Brown Shield, Inc., Batons, Vulcan Pioneers, or any member organization of the New Jersey Council of Charter Members of the National Black Police Association, Inc. as a duly authorized representative.

Under current law, counties and municipalities are required to grant leaves of absence with pay to any employee who attends a State or national convention of the New Jersey State Patrolmen's Benevolent Association, the Fraternal Order of Police, the Firemen's Mutual Benevolent Association, the Uniformed Firemen's Association, or the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police as a duly authorized representative.
