AN ACT concerning the administration of the oaths of office and
allegiance and amending R. S. 41:2-10.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. R. S. 41:2-10 is amended to read as follows:

2 41:2-10. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, any associate
3 justice thereof **[or]**, any judge of the Superior Court *or judge*
4 *of the tax court* may administer the oaths of office and of allegiance
5 to any person appointed to the office of Clerk of the Supreme
6 Court, Clerk of the Superior Court, Secretary of State or Attorney
7 General or to any other office as to which no other provision is made
8 by law.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to authorize a judge of the tax court to administer an oath of office or allegiance, or both, to a person appointed to the office of the Clerk of the Supreme or Superior Court, the Secretary of State, the Attorney General or any other office if the law does not otherwise provide for the administration of the required oaths for that office.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets **[thus]** in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter printed in italics *thus* is new matter.

Senate Bill No. 3438 authorizes a judge of the tax court to administer an oath of office or allegiance to a person appointed to the office of the Clerk of the Supreme or Superior Court, the Secretary of State, the Attorney General or any other office if the law does not otherwise provide for the administration of the required oaths for that office.
