### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: JUNE 23, 1983

The purpose of this bill is to permit county sheriffs to be members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System. These officers are, under current law, only eligible for enrollment in the Public Employees' Retirement System or one of the three county pension funds.

Under the bill, as amended by the Senate State Government Committee, no sheriff will qualify for PFRS membership if he has attained 37 years of age on the date of his application for membership.

In addition, a sheriff who transfers from PERS or a county fund to PFRS will be required to pay the difference between the contributions which he paid as a member of the former fund and what he would have been required to pay if he had been a member of PFRS since the date on which he was last enrolled in the former fund. He will also be liable for any payment for which the employer would otherwise be liable as the result of the transfer.

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

The Committee adopted a technical amendment to recognize the change made by P. L. 1982, c. 198, in the text of the section of law (C. 43:16A-1) amended by the bill.

The purpose of this bill is to allow county sheriffs the opportunity to join the Police and Firemen's Retirement System.

Amendments to the bill were adopted in order to:

- 1) provide that a county sheriff must apply for PFRS membership before he has reached the age of 37; and
- 2) require the transferee to "buy back" both his and the employer's payments to the system for the amount of the difference between what was paid as a PERS or county member and what would have been paid if he had been a PFRS member.

# FISCAL NOTE TO SENATE, No. 1102

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: OCTOBER 7, 1982

Senate Bill No. 1102, of 1982, would allow county sheriffs to join the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (P&FRS). The sheriff must apply before he is over 36 years of age, and time spent in the United States military service will be deducted from an applicant's age to determine eligibility.

The Division of Pensions notes that the sheriff could presently be a member of the Essex, Hudson, or Passaic County Pension Funds. If the individual is a member of the Public Employees' Retirement System (PERS), as is most likely the case, the county is now paying nearly 7% of salary for social security, and a little more than 9% for membership in the PERS. If the sheriff transfers to the P&FRS, as is likely, the social security coverage will continue, and the county will pay the additional cost for the P&FRS which is about 15% of salary. In addition, there may be a cost of 2%-3% of salary reflecting the years of service funded in the PERS. and the deficit created by the transfer of such credits to the P&FRS. Hence, the additional cost would be at least 10% of salary.

The Office of Legislative Services concurs.

Senate Bill No. 1102 OCR, of 1982, would allow county sheriffs to join the Police and Firemen's Retirement System (P & FRS). The sheriff must apply before he is over 37 years of age, and time spent in the United States military service will be deducted from an applicant's age to determine eligibility.

Based on one of the amendments to this bill, there would be no immediate direct cost to the State or any public employer (since the transferee from one system to another would have to buy back both his and the employer's payments to the retirement system for the difference between the two).

In the long run, there would be added costs at retirement since the P & FRS benefits are higher than PERS. Plus the added effect on the Pension Adjustment Program.
