AN ACT to amend the "State Police Retirement System Act," approved June 9, 1965 (P. L. 1965, c. 89).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 8 of P. L. 1965, c. 89 (C. 53:5A-8) is amended to read 2 as follows:

8. a. Any member of the retirement system [who was a member 3 of the former "State Police Retirement and Benevolent Fund" on 4 June 30, 1965,] may retire on a service retirement allowance upon 5 [the attainment of age 50 years and] the completion of at least 20 6 years of creditable service as a State policeman. Upon the filing 7 of a written and duly executed application with the retirement 8 9 system, setting forth at what time, not less than one month, subse-10 quent to the filing thereof he desires to be retired, any such mem-EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. ber retiring for service shall receive a service retirement allowancewhich shall consist of:

(1) An annuity which shall be the actuarial equivalent of hisaggregate contributions and

(2) A pension in the amount which, when added to the member's
annuity, will provide a total retirement allowance of 50% of his
final compensation [plus 1% of his final compensation multiplied by
his number of years of creditable service which exceed 25 years of
such service.

Except for the Superintendent of State Police, any member of the retirement system who was a member of the former "State Police Retirement and Benevolent Fund" on June 30, 1965, who has completed at least 25 years of creditable service and who has reached the age of 55 years shall be retired forthwith on the first day of the next calendar month, provided, however, any member the has not completed 25 years of creditable service shall not be required to retire on account of age until he has met the service 25c requirement].

26b. [Except for the Superintendent of State Police, any member 27of the retirement system who was not a member of the former 28"State Police Retirement and Benevolent Fund" on June 30, 1965 who has attained the age of 55 years' shall be retired forthwith on 29the first day of the next calendar month provided, however, such 30 member, at his option, may continue in the employment of the 31 32Division of State Police until he has completed 25 years of creditable service whereupon he shall be retired forthwith on the first 33 day of the next calendar month. Any such member, including the 3435superintendent, having attained at least the age of 55 years and retiring for service hereunder shall receive a service retirement 36allowance which shall consist of: 37

38 (1) An annuity which shall be the actuarial equivalent of his39 aggregate contributions and

40 (2) A pension in the amount which when added to the member's 41 annuity will provide a total retirement allowance of 2% of his final 42 compensation multiplied by his number of years of creditable ser-43 vice up to 25 plus 1% of his final compensation, multiplied by his 44 number of years of creditable service over 25.] (Deleted by amend-45 ment, P. 46 c. Upon the receipt of proper proofs of the death of a member

STATEMENT

This bill eliminates all reference to mandatory retirement ages in the State Police Retirement System, in conformance with the federal Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, the constitutionality of which was recently upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court in *EEOC v. Wyoming*, 103 S.Ct. 1054 (decided March 2, 1983). The bill also eliminates distinctions in retirement options previously in effect between troopers who were in the old retirement system and those in the current system.

This bill allows a member of the State Police Retirement System to retire with an allowance at the completion of 20 years of service, no matter what his age. The bill also eliminates references to mandatory retirement ages for members of the system.

A-3191, sponsored by Assemblyman John P. Doyle, D-Ocean, which makes explicit that the definition of "multiple dwelling" under the Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Law shall include certain complexes of ten or more detached structures on one panel of land or on contiguous parcels under common ownership.

<u>A-3566</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Christopher J. Jackman, D-Hudson, which eliminates all references to mandatory retirement ages in the State Police Retirement System.

<u>S-3158</u>, sponsored by State Senator Carmen A. Orechio, D-Essex, which waives the training requirements for persons with ten or more years of experience in any position allowed to opt over to be sheriffs officers.

<u>A-3328</u>, sponsored by Assemblywoman Maureen B. Ogden, R-Essex, which clarifies the meaning of "municipality" as used in the Recycling Act to apply only to municipalities situated within the boundaries of New Jersey.

<u>A-4057</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Alan J. Karcher, D-Middlesex, which permits secondary mortgage loan companies to make open-ended loans.

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
