An Act *[establishing]* *providing for the establishment of* an Advisory Commission on Hispanic Affairs, providing for appointment of its members and prescribing the powers, functions and duties of the commission, and establishing similar *[county]* advisory commissions in certain *municipalities and* counties.

STATEMENT

This bill creates a commission to advise the Governor and Legislature on the needs, concerns, accomplishments and contributions as well as the impact of legislation which affects the State's Hispanic community. The commission shall establish a subcommittee which shall meet with Hispanic community leaders and other groups to elicit input on community problems for use in the commission's work. The bill also requires counties with a 10% or more Hispanic population, as determined by the latest federal decennial census, to establish by resolution county Hispanic advisory commissions. These commissions will advise local governing bodies on matters affecting the Hispanic community and shall periodically report to and meet with the commission.

This bill, as amended, establishes an Advisory Commission on Hispanic Affairs at the State level and provides for establishment, under certain circumstances, of such commissions at the municipal and county levels.

The Statewide commission would consist of 10 members: two members of the Senate from different parties and two members of the General Assembly from different parties, to be appointed by the respective presiding officers; the Commissioner of Community Affairs; and five public members appointed for three-year terms by the Governor from the various Hispanic communities in the State. The commission would select its own chairperson and secretary.

The duty of the commission would be ::to advise the Governor and Legislature on the needs, concerns, accomplishments and contributions as well as the impact of legislation which affects the State's Hispanic community." The bill provides for establishment of a five-member subcommittee of the commission which would "elicit input from Hispanic communities" by meeting with community leaders and attending and sponsoring community meetings. The subcommittee would report its findings and recommendations at the request of the chairperson.

The bill also requires municipalities and counties with an Hispanic population of 10% or more to establish a five member municipal or county Hispanic advisory commission, which would operate in a manner similar to that of the State commission.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

The committee amended the bill to mandate the establishment of municipal Hispanic advisory commissions and to provide for the composition, appointment and length of term applicable to the membership of the municipal and county advisory commissions.

Assembly Bill No. 2150 establishes a commission to advise the Governor and Legislature on the needs, concerns, accomplishments and contributions of the Hispanic community in the State as well as the impact of legislation which affects the State's Hispanic community. The bill also requires certain counties with a 10% or more Hispanic population to establish advisory commissions.

The Department of Community Affairs estimates that the costs for this proposal are as follows:

There are two counties in the State which would have the local advisory commission which may generate costs to them or be part of State-aid. The cost amounts are indeterminable.

The Office of Legislative Services concurs with the estimate by the Department of Community Affairs with an additional note that start up costs initially stated were not part of a full fiscal year amount.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1980, c. 67.
