1 AN ACT concerning '[certain disabled person]' identification cards and placards 1 issued to certain persons with a disability 1 and 2 amending various parts of the statutory law. 3

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 1 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-204) is amended to read as follows:
- 1. The term ["handicapped] ¹["disabled person"] "person with 10 a disability" as employed herein shall include any person who has 11 12 lost the use of one or more limbs as a consequence of paralysis, 13 amputation, or other permanent disability or who '[is permanently disabled] has a permanent disability as to be unable to ambulate 14 without the aid of an assisting device or whose mobility is 15 16 otherwise limited as certified by a physician with a plenary license 17 to practice medicine and surgery in this State or a bordering State; a 18 podiatrist licensed to practice in this State or a bordering state; a 19 physician stationed at a military or naval installation located in this 20 State who is licensed to practice in any state; [or,] a chiropractic 21 physician licensed to practice in this State or a bordering state ; a 22 physician assistant licensed to practice in this State or a bordering 23 state; or a nurse practitioner licensed to practice in this State or a 24 bordering state.

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- 2. Section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-205) is amended to read as follows:
- 29 The [Director] Chief Administrator of the [Division of Motor Vehicles in the Department of Law and Public Safety] New 30 Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue, at the expense of the 31 State of New Jersey, [handicapped] '[disabled]' person 'with a 32 disability¹ identification cards upon the application of qualifying 33 34 disabled 1 persons ¹with disabilities ¹, as [handicapped] heretofore defined, and after due investigation of the qualifying 35 36 status of each applicant. Said card shall, amongst other things, identify the [handicapped] '[disabled]' persons 'with disabilities' 37 38 and the registration number of the vehicle for 39 wheelchair symbol license plates have been issued under the

provisions of section 3 of [this act] P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-206) 1 and shall state that he is a [handicapped] '[disabled]' person 'with 2 a disability validly qualified hereunder to receive such card, that 3 said card is for the exclusive use of the person to whom it has been 4 5 duly issued, is nontransferable and will be forfeited if presented by any other person, and that any abuse of any privilege, benefit, 6 7 precedence or consideration granted to any person to whom such 8 card may be issued will be sufficient cause for revocation of said 9 card, corresponding windshield placard and wheelchair symbol 10 license plates, and the same may be forfeited or revoked 11 accordingly, and in the absence of any such forfeiture or revocation said card shall be valid [indefinitely] until the last day of the 36th 12 calendar month following the calendar month in which that card 13 14 was issued.

Every application for the issuance or renewal of a '[disabled]' 15 person 'with a disability' identification card shall contain a 16 17 statement signed by a physician, podiatrist, chiropractic physician, 18 physician assistant, or nurse practitioner licensed to practice in this 19 State or a bordering state or a physician stationed at a military or naval installation located in this State who is licensed to practice in 20 21 any state, certifying that the applicant's stated disability qualifies the applicant to meet the definition of '["disabled person"] "person 22 with a disability" pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-23 204). In order to be approved, the application for a '[disabled]' 24 person 'with a disability' identification card shall be submitted to 25 the commission not more than 60 days following the date upon 26 27 which a physician, podiatrist, chiropractic physician, physician 28 assistant, or nurse practitioner certifies that the applicant meets the definition of '["disabled person"] "person with a disability" 29 pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-204). The 30 31 application shall also include any additional information pertinent 32 to the certification which the chief administrator, in the chief 33 administrator's discretion, may require, including, but not limited 34 to, the National Provider Identifier or state-issued licensing number 35 of the physician, podiatrist, chiropractic physician, physician 36 assistant, or nurse practitioner who certifies the applicant's eligibility for a '[disabled]' person 'with a disability' 37 identification card. 38

Any placard issued by the 21 chief administrator shall display, in a clearly visible manner, the 22 date on which it shall become invalid. The placard may be renewed 23 upon application in accordance with the requirements of this

Any placard issued prior to the effective date of P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall be deemed invalid on the last day of the 36th calendar month following the calendar month in which such effective date occurs. The chief administrator may recall any placard deemed invalid pursuant to this section.

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Notwithstanding any provision of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-204 et seq.) to the contrary, the chief of police of each municipality in this State shall issue a temporary placard of not more than six months' duration to any person who has temporarily lost the use of one or more limbs or '[is temporarily disabled] has a temporary disability¹ as to be unable to ambulate without the aid of an assisting device or whose mobility is otherwise temporarily limited, as certified by a physician with a plenary license to practice medicine and surgery in this State or a bordering State; a podiatrist licensed to practice in this State or a bordering state; a physician stationed at a military or naval installation located in this State who is licensed to practice in any state; [or] a chiropractic physician licensed to practice in this State or a bordering state ; a physician assistant licensed to practice in this State or a bordering state; or a nurse practitioner licensed to practice in this State or a bordering state. The <u>temporary</u> placard may be renewed one time at the discretion of the issuing authority for a period of not more than six months' duration. The placard shall be displayed on the motor vehicle used by the '[temporarily [handicapped] <u>disabled</u>]' person 'with a temporary disability' and shall give the person the right to park overtime or to use special parking places established for use by [handicapped] '[disabled]' persons 'with disabilities' in any municipality of this State.

The fee for the issuance of [such] <u>a</u> temporary [or permanent] placard issued pursuant to this section shall be \$4.00 and payable to the [Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles] <u>New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission</u>. No fee shall be charged for the issuance of a permanent placard issued pursuant to this section.

The [director] chief administrator may, in addition, issue license plates bearing the national wheelchair symbol for:

The windshield placard shall be displayed on the vehicle when the vehicle is used to transport [handicapped] '[disabled]' nursing home residents 'with disabilities'. A vehicle displaying this windshield placard is authorized to park in a space appropriately marked for vehicles for '[the physically [handicapped] disabled] persons with physical disabilities' only when delivering or receiving [handicapped] '[disabled]' nursing home residents 'with disabilities' from one location to another. The vehicle is not permitted to park in '[designated]' [handicapped] '[disabled]' parking spaces designated for persons with disabilities' when it is not transporting [handicapped] '[disabled]' nursing home residents 'with disabilities'.

The fee for the issuance of the identification card and corresponding windshield placard issued pursuant to this section is \$4.00 and is payable to the [Director] Chief Administrator of the [Division of Motor Vehicles] New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission.

1 **AN ACT** concerning handicapped parking and amending P.L.1949, c.280.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 2 of P.L.1949, c.280 (C.39:4-205) is amended to read as follows:
- 9 2. a. The [Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles in the 10 Department of Law and Public Safety Chief Administrator of the 11 Motor Vehicle Commission in the Department of Transportation 12 shall issue, at the expense of the State of New Jersey, handicapped person identification cards upon the application of qualifying 13 14 handicapped persons, as heretofore defined, and after due 15 investigation of the qualifying status of each applicant. Said card 16 shall, amongst other things, identify the handicapped persons and 17 the registration number of the vehicle for which any wheelchair 18 symbol license plates have been issued under the provisions of 19 section 3 of this act and shall state that he is a handicapped person 20 validly qualified hereunder to receive such card, that said card is for 21 the exclusive use of the person to whom it has been duly issued, is 22 nontransferable and will be forfeited if presented by any other 23 person, and that any abuse of any privilege, benefit, precedence or 24 consideration granted to any person to whom such card may be 25 issued will be sufficient cause for revocation of said card, 26 corresponding windshield placard and wheelchair symbol license 27 plates, and the same may be forfeited or revoked accordingly, and 28 in the absence of any such forfeiture or revocation said card shall be 29 valid [indefinitely] for a period of time as prescribed by the Chief 30 Administrator of the Motor Vehicle Commission.
 - b. Application for issuance or renewal of a handicapped person identification card in the form of an individual placard or decal shall include:
 - (1) A certificate, signed and dated within six months preceding the date of application, by a licensed physician or a certified nurse practitioner that the applicant is a person with a disability or a certificate, signed and dated within six months preceding the date of application; and
 - (2) The state-issued licensing number of the licensed physician, certified nurse practitioner, or licensed physician assistant who signed the certificate described in paragraph (1) of this section; and
- 42 (3) The number of a current, valid driver license, identification 43 card, or handicapped identification card issued to the applicant by 44 the department.

- c. The corresponding windshield placard shall be renewed concurrently upon the renewal of the handicapped person identification card as directed by the chief administrator. The expiration date shall be clearly visible on the placard in a manner prescribed by the chief administrator.
 - d. Renewal of a handicapped person identification card shall occur every four years at the Motor Vehicle Commission in conjunction with license renewal.

This certification shall be provided on a standard form to be developed by the <code>[director] chief administrator</code> in consultation with local chiefs of police and representatives of the handicapped. The form shall contain only

those conditions constituting temporary disability as are provided in this section. The physical presence of the handicapped person shall not be required for the issuance of a temporary handicapped placard.

The placard may be renewed one time at the discretion of the issuing authority for a period of not more than six months' duration. The expiration date shall be clearly visible on the placard. The application for renewal of a handicapped person identification card or parking placard shall include a signed statement from the holder of the permit saying that the person continues to qualify to hold the card and placard. The placard shall be displayed on the motor vehicle used by the temporarily handicapped person and shall give the person the right to park overtime or to use special parking places established for use by handicapped persons in any municipality of this State.

The fee for the issuance of such temporary or permanent placard issued pursuant to this section shall be \$4.00 and payable to the [Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles] Chief Administrator of the Motor Vehicle Commission.

STATEMENT

Provides certain restrictions in acquiring and displaying handicapped placards.

Specifically, this bill requires a medical professionals certification to attain and renew a handicap person identification card or placard, requires all handicap windshield placards to be issued with a prominently displayed expiration date, and requires that permanent placards be renewed every four years in conjunction with license renewal.

Under New Jersey law, only the person issued the identification card may use the placard. If the driver is not the person in possession of a handicapped identification card, the person must be present in the vehicle. Regulations also prohibit a placard holder from allowing someone else to use their placard.

A2947 SINGLETON, BURZICHELLI

A person who illegally obtains handicapped placards may be prosecuted under the criminal code for falsifying records. If convicted, the offender may be subject to a fine up to \$10,000, and a term of imprisonment of up to 18 months, or both.

Several States including Florida, California, Pennsylvania, Oregon, and Wisconsin have some or all of these restrictions in place. It has been reported that some individuals continue to use disabled parking permits after they no longer need them.

Currently, there is no requirement for the placards to contain a visible expiration date. Although this will not completely guard against the fraud, these requirements would assist law enforcement in quickly detecting expired placards and curtail misuse by New Jersey residents.

The substitute bill also extends the ability to certify a person as disabled to physician assistants and nurse practitioners licensed in this State or a bordering state.

Finally, the substitute eliminates the fee currently permitted in statute for the issuance of permanent placards.
