#### **STATEMENT**

This bill would exempt the designated operators of emergency, rescue or other motorized apparatus or equipment utilized by either the State Office of Emergency Management or any local Office of Emergency Management for disaster or emergency control or response or for routine operational purposes from having to secure a commercial driver's license.

This bill is modeled on P.L.1989, c.164 (C.39:3-10j et seq.) which waived the commercial driver's license requirements for designated operators of firefighting equipment, certain operators of military vehicles owned or operated by the United States Department of Defense or National Guard, operators of farm vehicles operated with 150 miles of the person's farm, and the operators of emergency or rescue equipment operated for the purposes of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad or for disaster control.

The Assembly Homeland Security and State Preparedness Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1753.

As amended and reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 1753 exempts members of the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management or any local Office of Emergency Management from having to secure a commercial driver's license under certain circumstances.

Federal law currently allows states to waive the commercial driver's license requirements designated for firefighters or other persons who operate vehicles used for the preservation of life or property or the execution of emergency governmental functions. Under N.J.S.A. 39:3-10k, New Jersey waives commercial driver's license requirements for operators of emergency or rescue equipment operated for the purposes of a first aid, ambulance or rescue squad or for disaster control. The amended bill clarifies that members of State and local Office of Emergency Management are to be included among first responders who are exempted from the State's commercial driver's license requirements.

As introduced, this bill required the MVC to adopt rules and regulations, including guidelines for safety training programs the various Offices of Emergency Management are to provide for their designated operators. The amendments to this bill eliminate the requirement that MVC establish such guidelines.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2012-2013 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The committee amendments:

(1) limit the exemption from the commercial driver's license requirements to members of the State Office of Emergency Management (OEM) or local OEM;

- (2) ensure that the waiver applies to members of OEM who operate vehicles designated for the preservation of life or property or the execution of emergency governmental functions; and
- (3) eliminate the requirement that the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) establish guidelines for safety training programs of OEM members.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1753(1R).

As amended and reported, this bill exempts members of the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management or any county or municipal Office of Emergency Management from having to secure a commercial driver's license under certain circumstances. The amended bill specifies that members of State, county, and municipal Offices of Emergency Management are to be exempted from commercial driver's license requirements only if:

- (1) the operation of the vehicle, apparatus, or equipment is necessary to the preservation of life or property or the execution of emergency governmental functions;
- (2) the vehicle, apparatus, or equipment operated is equipped with audible and visual signals and is not subject to normal traffic regulations; and
- (3) the operation of the vehicle, apparatus, or equipment meets any other requirement set forth under federal law, rule, or regulation pertaining the federal "Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act."

The amended bill further specifies that an exemption may not be granted if, to do so, the State would no longer be in a position of substantial compliance with the requirements of the federal "Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act."

The committee amended the bill to clarify that the exemption applies only to persons who operate a vehicle, apparatus, or equipment equipped with audible and visual signals, and not subject to normal traffic regulations. In addition, the amendments specify that an exemption may not be granted if, to do so, the State would no longer be in a position of substantial compliance with the requirements of the federal "Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act."

The amendments also specify that the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission may promulgate rules and regulations to effectuate the provisions of the act, but it is not required to do so. Finally, the amendments make a technical correction to the reference to the federal "Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act."

Assembly Bill No. 1753(1R), as amended and reported, is identical to Senate Bill No. 440, which was also amended and reported by the committee on this day.
