An Act to amend the title of "An act authorizing counties and municipalities to acquire, maintain, improve and operate public transportation passenger stations," approved October 20, 1964 (P. L. 1964, c. 209), so that the same shall read "An act authorizing counties and municipalities to acquire, maintain, improve and operate public transportation passenger and freight rail lines," and to amend the body of said act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. The title of P. L. 1964, c. 209 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 An act authorizing counties and municipalities to acquire, maintain,
- 3 improve and operate public transportation [stations] and freight
- 4 rail lines.
- 1 2. Section 1 of P. L. 1964, c. 209 (C. 40:9-2.1) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 1. The [board of chosen freeholders of any county or the] gov-

- 5 chase or lease, maintain, improve, equip and operate any existing

STATEMENT

This bill authorizes counties and municipalities to acquire, maintain, improve and operate public transportation passenger and freight rail line.

Forty-five segments of rail lines throughout the State have been filed for abandonment under the expedited abandonment procedures of the Northeast Rail Service Act of 1981. These procedures provide for the abandonment, within 90 days of filing, of rail lines for which an offer of assistance has not been tendered.

This bill would give local governments the opportunity to either operate these lines on a continuing basis or until they can be sold to a private entity, thereby insuring a continuation of essential transportation services.

TRENTON---Legislation to permit counties and municipalities to acquire and operate passenger and freight rail lines was signed into law yesterday by Governor Thomas H. Kean.

The legislation, A-949, sponsored by Assemblyman Robert Littell, R-Sussex, will permit Sussex County to issue bonds to purchase a freight line scheduled to be abandoned by Conrail. It also permits the county to sell or lease the line to a private developer.
