An Act concerning temporary permits for the sale of alcoholic beverages and amending R. S. 33:1-74.

- BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
 - 2 of New Jersey:
 - 1 1. R. S. 33:1-74 is amended to read as follows:
 - 2 33:1-74. a. To provide for contingencies where it would be appro-
 - 3 priate and consonant with the spirit of this chapter to issue a
- 4 license but the contingency has not been expressly provided for,
- 5 the director of the division may for special cause shown, subject

- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

Under the Alcoholic Beverage Law, the sale of alcoholic beverages may be prohibited completely, or on certain days (usually Sunday), as a result of municipal ordinance, referendum or absence of municipal enabling legislation.

The Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control is also authorized by law to issue one day special permits to civic, religious, educational and other qualified nonprofit organizations to permit the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on a designated premises. Qualified organizations and educational institutions avail themselves of these permits to raise funds to further the group's civic, religious or charitable objectives, programs or purposes.

Because of the prohibition against sales of alcoholic beverages on Sundays in 35 municipalities and total prohibition in 42 other municipalities, these worthwhile groups and the important functions they perform for a community are currently precluded from, or limited in, obtaining a one day special permit.

The bill amends R. S. 33:1-74 to permit the Director to issue one day permits to qualified organizations for sales on a day that would otherwise be prohibited. Administrative regulations provide for safeguards, review and municipal approval requirements as set forth in N.J.A.C. 13:2-5.1.
