- 4 a. "Contest of chance" means any contest, game, pool, gaming
- 5 scheme or gaming device in which the outcome depends in a ma-
- 6 terial degree upon an element of chance, notwithstanding that skill
- 7 of the contestants or some other persons may also be a factor
- 8 therein.
- 9 b. "Gambling" means staking or risking something of value
- 10 upon the outcome of a contest of chance or a future contingent event
- 11 not under the actor's control or influence, upon an agreement or
- 12 understanding that he will receive something of value in the event
- 13 of a certain outcome.
- 14 c. "Player" means a person who engages in any form of gam-
- 15 bling solely as a contestant or bettor, without receiving or becoming
- 16 entitled to receive any profit therefrom other than personal gam-
- 17 bling winnings, and without otherwise rendering any material
- 18 assistance to the establishment, conduct or operation of the par-
- 19 ticular gambling activity. A person who gambles at a social game
- 20 of chance on equal terms with the other participants therein does

d. "Something of value" means any money or property, any 28 token, object or article exchangeable for money or property, or any 29 **3**0 form of credit or promise directly or indirectly contemplating 31 transfer of money or property or of any interest therein, or involving extension of a service, entertainment or a privilege of playing 32 at a game or scheme without charge. This definition, however, does 33 not include any form of promise involving extension of a privilege 34 of playing at a game without charge on a mechanical or electronic 35 amusement device*, other than a slot machine* as an award for 36

37 the attainment of a certain score on that device.

e. "Gambling device" means any device, machine, paraphernalia or equipment which is used or usable in the playing phases of any gambling activity, whether such activity consists of gambling between persons or gambling by a person involving the playing of a machine. Notwithstanding the foregoing, lottery tickets, policy slips and other items used in the playing phases of lottery and policy schemes are not gambling devices.

f. "Slot machine" means any mechanical, electrical or other device, contrivance or machine which, upon insertion of a coin, token or similar object therein, or upon payment of any consideration whatsoever, is available to play or operate, the play or operation of which, whether by reason of the skill of the operator or application of the element of chance, or both, may deliver or entitle the person playing or operating the machine to receive cash or tokens to be exchanged for cash, whether the payoff is made automatically from the machine or in any other manner whatsoever. A device so constructed, or readily adaptable or convertible to such use, is no less a slot machine because it is not in working order or because some mechanical act of manipulation or repair is required to accomplish its adaptation, conversion or workability.

g. "Bookmaking" means advancing gambling activity by unlawfully accepting bets from members of the public upon the outcome of future contingent events as a business.

61 h. "Lottery" means an unlawful gambling scheme in which (a) 62 the players pay or agree to pay something of value for chances, 63 represented and differentiated by numbers or by combinations of 64 numbers or by some other media, one or more of which chances

- 65 are to be designated the winning ones; and (b) the winning chances
- 66 are to be determined by a drawing or by some other method based
- 67 upon the element of chance; and (c) the holders of the winning
- 68 chances are to receive something of value.
- 69 i. "Policy" or "the numbers game" means a form of lottery
- 70 in which the winning chances or plays are not determined upon the
- 71 basis of a drawing or other act on the part of persons conducting or

DATED: MAY 20, 1982

This bill amends the New Jersey Code of Criminal Justice to make it legal to offer free games on mechanical or electronic amusement devices, such as pinball machines and electronic games as rewards for the attainment of certain scores on those devices. The Attorney General's office has reviewed this bill and has indicated that the present language does indeed prohibit such an offer.

As presently worded, chapter 37 (gambling offenses) of the criminal code technically prohibits as a form of lottery the awarding of free games on mechanical or electronic amusement devices (i.e. pinball machines and electronic games) as a reward for the attainment of certain scores on those devices. This bill would clarify that the awarding of free games for the attainment of certain scores on mechanical or electronic amusement devices is legal.
