An Act concerning basic child study teams and supplementing chapter 46 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, the authorization for Basic Child Study Teams exists only in the Administrative Code. Assembly Bill No. 568 provides statutory authorization and, in addition, permits the staff member making the referral to participate in the evaluation of the student.

The committee recommends that the Department of Education clarify and make more specific the provisions in the Administrative Code referring to parental participation in the decision of the Child Study Team (N. J. A. C. 6:28–1.1 et seq.).
