An Act concerning county detectives in certain counties and amending N. J. S. 2A:157-8.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

- 1 1. N. J. S. 2A:157-8 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 2A:157-8. In counties of the fifth class with a population of
- 3 [300,000] 400,000 or less there may be appointed not in excess of
- 4 12 county detectives, and in counties of the fifth class with a
- 5 population in excess of [300,000] 400,000 there may be appointed
- 6 not in excess of 15 county detectives, of whom one may be desig-
- 7 nated chief of county detectives, one captain of county detectives.

Senate Bill No. 1201 authorizes counties of the fifth class (Monmouth, Ocean, and Atlantic) to increase the permissible number of lieutenants of county detectives from two to four. At present, counties of the fifth class are authorized to designate one chief of county detectives, one captain of county detectives and two lieutenants of county detectives.

This bill passed the Senate in the current legislative session by a vote of 39-0.

In fifth class counties (Monmouth, Ocean, Atlantic), there is presently authorization for the designation of one chief of county detectives; one captain of county detectives and two lieutenants of county detectives.
