This bill amends P. L. 1949, c. 280 to provide a definition of handicapped person as someone who has lost the use of one or more limbs, or who is permanently disabled so as to be unable to ambulate without the aid of an assisting device or whose mobility is otherwise limited as certified by a licensed physician. In addition, the bill provides that the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles shall issue, at the expense of the State of New Jersey,

handicapped person identification cards for qualified persons applying for such cards.

The bill amends existing law by eliminating any possible use of metal insignias or markers on license plates and replaces them with placards. It provides that the director shall issue to a qualified person a placard indicating that a handicapped person identification card has been issued to the person designated therein. The placard is to be displayed in a manner determined by the director on a motor vehicle used to transport the handicapped person when the vehicle is parked overtime or in special parking spaces established for use by handicapped persons. The fee for the issuance of a placard by the director shall be \$2.00.

Furthermore, the bill provides that the director may, in addition, issue license plates bearing the national wheelchair symbol for not more than two motor vehicles owned, operated or leased by a handicapped person or by any person furnishing transportation on his behalf.

This bill also permits a municipality to issue a temporary placard for persons who are temporarily handicapped.

This bill amends P. L. 1949, c. 280 by removing the definition of "amputee" and by providing a definition of handicapped person as someone who has lost the use of one or more limbs, or who is permanently disabled so as to be unable to ambulate without the aid of an assisting device or whose mobility is otherwise limited as certified by a licensed physician.

Assembly Bill No. 1395 provides that the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles shall issue, at the expense of the State of New Jersey, handicapped person identification cards for qualified persons applying for such cards. These new cards will be issued to handicapped persons, identifying the person and a particular vehicle which is owned, operated or leased by a handicapped person or a person furnishing transportation to that handicapped person. These cards are to replace the special vehicle identification cards presently issued only to those persons defined as "amputees" that are renewed on a annual basis. As provided in this legislation, the handicapped person identification cards are to be valid indefinitely.

The bill amends existing law by eliminating any possible use of metal insignias or markers on license plates and replaces them with placards. It provides that the director shall issue to a qualified person a windshield placard indicating that a handicapped person identification card has been issued to the person designated therein. The placard is to be displayed in a manner determined by the director on a motor vehicle used to transport the handicapped person when the vehicle is parked overtime or in special parking spaces established for use by handicapped persons. The fee for the issuance of a placard by the director shall be \$2.00.

Whereas use of the metal insignia or marker is limited to the single particular motor vehicle on which such insignia or marker is displayed, the placard can be utilized by any qualified handicapped person when the placard is displayed in such manner as the director determines on a motor vehicle used to transport this individual.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets Ithus in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Furthermore, the bill amends existing law to provide that the director may, in addition, issue license plates bearing the national wheelchair symbol for not more than two motor vehicles owned, operated or leased by a handicapped person or by any person furnishing transportation on his behalf. At present, only one set of license plates bearing the national wheelchair symbol are issued and then only for a vehicle owned or operated by a disabled person.

This bill also permits a municipality to issue a temporary placard for persons who are temporarily handicapped for a period up to 6 months which may be used within the respective municipality for parking overtime or in special parking places established for use by handicapped persons. As amended by the committee, the bill provides that the placard may be renewed one time at the discretion of the issuing authority for a period not exceeding an additional 6 month period.

The Division of Motor Vehicles supports this bill.

L. 1949, c. 280 by eliminating the definition of "amputee" and instead substitutes a definition of handicapped person as someone who has lost the use of one or more limbs through paralysis, amputation or disability, or who is permanently disabled so as to be unable to ambulate without the aid of an assisting device or whose mobility is otherwise limited as certified by a licensed physician.

The bill requires the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue, at the expense of the State of New Jersey, handicapped person identification cards to qualified applicants. The cards would identify the person and a particular vehicle which is owned, operated, or leased by the handicapped person or a person furnishing transportation to that handicapped person. These cards are to replace the special vehicle identification cards presently issued annually to those persons defined as "amputees." As provided in this legislation, the handicapped person identification cards are to be valid indefinitely.

The bill amends existing law by eliminating any possible use of metal insignias or markers on license plates and replaces them with placards. It provides that the director shall issue to a qualified person a wind-shield placard indicating that a handicapped person identification card has been issued to the person designated therein. The placard is to be displayed in a manner determined by the director on a motor vehicle used to transport the handicapped person when the vehicle is parked overtime or in a special parking space established for use by handicapped persons. The fee for the issuance of a placard by the director, as provided by amendment of the Senate committee, is \$4.00.

Whereas use of the metal insignia or marker is limited to the single particular motor vehicle on which such insignia or marker is displayed, the placard can be utilized by any qualified handicapped person when the placard is displayed in such manner as the director determines, on a motor vehicle used to transport this individual. Furthermore, the bill amends existing law to provide that the director may, in addition, issue license plates bearing the national wheelchair symbol for not more than two motor vehicles owned, operated or leased by a handicapped person or by any person furnishing transportation on his behalf. At present, only one set of license plates bearing the national wheelchair symbol are issued and then only for a vehicle owned or operated by a disabled person.

This bill also permits a municipality to issue a temporary placard for persons who are temporarily handicapped for a period up to 6 months which may be used within the respective municipality for parking overtime or in special parking places established for use by handicapped persons. As amended by the Assembly committee, the bill provides that the placard may be renewed one time at the discretion of the issuing authority for a period not exceeding an additional 6-month period. The fee for the temporary card would also be \$4.00.

The fees for both temporary and permanent placards would be payable to the Division of Motor Vehicles, as provided by Senate committee amendment.

The Division of Motor Vehicles supports this bill.

The Senate Reprint of Assembly Bill No. 1395 of 1980 requires the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue, at State expense, identification cards for vehicles owned or leased by handicapped persons.

The Department of Law and Public Safety estimates that enactment of this legislation will have no effect on State funds.

The bill slightly modifies an existing program, which will not affect program costs.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1980, c. 67.

A-86, sponsored by W. Cary Edwards (R-Bergen), which amends the Municipal Land Use Law to require every municipality to prepare a storm water management plan and to adopt a storm water control ordinance. The intent of the law is to make storm water control an integral part of a municipality's master planning and such a municipal sotrm water management plan would have to conform to state, county, soil conservation district and federal regulations.

A-112, sponsored by Thomas A. Gallo (D-Hudson), which permits certain undersheriffs to purchase certain prior service credit in the Police and Firemen's Retirement System.

A-274, sponsored by Vincent Ozzie Pellecchia (D-Passaic), which extends the benefits of certain county employees' pension funds to widows and widowers in certain circumstances.

S-1299, sponsored by William J. Hamilton (D-Middlesex), which permits a member of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System who is elected to public office to continue to be a member of that retirement system during his tenure and to maintain his rate of contribution at the same level prior to the contributor's election.

A-1388, sponsored by Vincent Ozzie Pellecchia (D-Passaic), which designates the Department of Community Affairs to promulgate and enforce the "barrier free" building code on behalf of the handicapped. Primary enforcement was in the Treasury Department's Division of Building, which required state inspectors to enforce codes on other than state buildings. The "barrier free" regulations will now be enforced in accordance with the State Uniform Construction Code.

A-1395, sponsored by Francis J. McManimon (D-Mercer), which amends and updates provisions of Public Law 1949, C.280 to allow the Director of the Division of Motor Vehicles to issue special identification cards to the handicapped and special placards or license plates for their autos. The primary intent of the legislation is to provide a standardized identification card, similiar to the widely accepted driver's license, for handicapped persons.
