# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: MAY 22, 1980

This bill establishes reasonable hours of operation for solid waste disposal facilities except when the public health, safety and welfare require otherwise.

The committee amended the bill to make the hour limitation apply only to facilities in and around residential areas, and added baling facilities and transfer stations to recycling and resource recovery facilities as exempt facilities.

### STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: NOVEMBER 24, 1980

As amended by the Senate Energy and Environment Committee, this bill would require that the operations of solid waste disposal facilities located in or within 1,000 feet of any area zoned residential be limited to the hours between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Resource recovery facilities, baling facilities, transfer stations and recycling facilities would be exempt from this restriction, which could also be waived for other facilities if the Department of Environmental Protection determines that the public health, safety and welfare so requires.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1175, with Senate committee amendments, which was also reported today.
